



IMAGINATION LIBRARY A SUCCESS

In 2018, Lake County pre schoolers received 1,746 free books mailed directly to their home by the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, thanks to the Friends of Lake County Library, the 93.5 The Goose, and dozens of local businesses, organizations, and individuals. As of December 31, 2018, over 200 Lake County kids were registered for the program, which mails a free, age-appropriate book per month to children under 5. Parents can register their children at any time at their local library or online at imaginationlibrary. com.


The Imagination Library is free to every Lake County child under 5 no matter their income. The goal of the program is to inspire a love of reading, which is a key indicator of future school success. Parents are encouraged to register their preschooler today to bring home the benefits of reading together.

Studies have shown that when parents read to their children, kindergarten readiness improves. Parents reading to their children from birth can have lifelong positive benefits. The Imagination Library puts books directly into children's homes, and research has shown significant positive benefits for children in the program.

"We are very proud of the success of our first year in the program," said Shelley Batty, Friends Imagination Library Committee member. "We have already registered over 60% of Lake County children for the program – a level most communities do not reach for several years. Our high registration and the amount of financial support we've received from local people and organizations really shows Lake County's strong commitment to education in action."

The program costs local sponsors \$25 per child annually. If all eligible preschoolers registered, the program would cost over \$8,000 per year. Fortunately, an Oregon family foundation will cover half of the local costs for the first three years. The Friends' are over halfway to their goal of beginning each year with two years' full operating costs in the fund. 


All was forgiven.

BACK IN THYME

Restless Leg Syndrome: (RLS)

I recently had a request for information on RLS from a young lady who suffers quite a lot from this. It is also known as Kborn's syndrome. One in Twenty people have RLS. It causes one or more symptoms., including cramps or a "antsy" feeling in the legs, jumpiness and leg trashing, numbness, painful pins and needles sensations, or the feeling that something is crawling under the skin of the leg. Typically, the discomfort is felt deep within the calf, also many have had discomfort in the arms, the trunk and or genitals. The exact cause is unknown, however it is believed to be a genetic neurological condition activated by a chemical imbalance in the brain or spinal cord. It has also been linked to iron or folic acid deficiency, especially in people with kidney disease. It is also believed to be caused by decreased circulation to the legs.

RLS can be difficult to treat. Weight reduction (if necessary) and regular exercise are recommended, avoidance of alcohol, alleviation of any stress related situation, avoidance of caffeine in all forms at least 3 hours before bedtime, the elimination of food allergies and sensitivities, and a supplement of blue or green algae (as a substitute for L tryptophan and especially for people whose symptoms can be relieved by massage or movement of the limbs. Folic acid supplement is recommended. Also take recommended dosage of any calcium/magnesium supplement at bedtime.

- Stop Smoking, as it impairs blood flow to the leg muscles.
- Vitamin E- 400 IU, two or three times a day in extremely effective in alleviating this condition.
- California Poppy and Corydalis work well and cause no stomach upset.
- Iron Supplements taken for a maximum of three month, can reverse symptoms.
- Keep Bedroom quiet and Cool. Soak feet in cool water for relief. Massage legs from knee down calf all the way to anklebone and back up to knee vigorously.
- Passionflower Tea induces muscle relaxation and sleepiness.
- Rooibos Tea reduces spasms, induces sleep, stops generalized inflammation and pain.
- Valarian Tablets sedates muscles: reduces time required to fall asleep.
