February 11, 2019 (Bend, OR) – Oliver Tatom today filed as a candidate for the Central Oregon Community College Board of Directors. He is running to represent Zone 7, which extends roughly from the High Desert Museum south of Bend through Newberry Country to Fort Rock and Gilchrist. The seat is currently held by Vikki Ricks, who is not seeking reelection.

"As a third generation Oregonian and a second generation COCC student," Oliver said, "I am committed to a thriving community college that provides a ladder up to residents in all six counties of the college district."

A second year nursing student at COCC, Oliver currently serves as president of the 2019 nursing class. He is a nationally registered and state licensed paramedic, and for the past four years he has been employed by Jefferson County EMS in Madras. He contracts as an American Heart Association certified instructor for Cascade Training, teaching courses on basic and advanced life support. And he serves on the board of directors of the Central Oregon Disability Support Network.

Oliver said he was motivated to run by his experience as a student leader working to overcome barriers to higher education for working parents and rural residents. "The college has had several years of declining enrollment. Rather than making low-cost investments to attract and retain non-traditional students, the college continues to cut and wait for the next recession. I love COCC, but we deserve better."

Oliver Tatom lives in rural Deschutes County southeast of Bend. He graduated from Bend High School, earned a Bachelor of Arts in American Studies from the University of Southern California, and trained as a paramedic at the Yale-New Haven Sponsor Hospital Program in Connecticut. His wife, Amy Tatom, is a candidate for Bend-La Pine School Board. They have two children.

The election will be held on May 21, 2019.




Crater Lake Hospitality Announces New Winter Hours

Firewood permits available Monday at Fremont-Winema National Forest offices LAKEVIEW, Ore. – Beginning Monday, February 11, personal use firewood permits for 2019 will be on sale at all Fremont-Winema National Forest offices.

The Forest recently adjusted the permit sales, extending the season, for improved customer service.

Permits are available for \$5 per cord with a minimum purchase of four cords. A maximum of eight cords per household is allowed to be cut annually. A cord equates to a wood stack that is four feet wide by four feet high by eight feet long. Firewood permits for 2019 will expire on December 31, 2019.

Firewood permit holders need to be aware of the terms and conditions of their permit. Motorized access for the removal of firewood with a permit is allowed up to 300 feet off roads in firewood cutting areas.

Woodcutters are encouraged to cut firewood in late spring and early fall, while paying attention to weather and road conditions to avoid resource damage. Some woodcutting areas may be inaccessible due to snow or wet conditions.


Minimizing damage to roads helps ensure the Forest is able to continue offering public access and also reduces natural resource impacts like erosion and diminished water quality. If a user can see tire tracks on the road in the vehicle's rearview mirror, conditions are too wet and drivers should turn around to avoid damage to the road.

During the summer, woodcutters need to monitor current fire and public use restrictions which may prohibit chainsaw operations. This is critical for public safety, preserve natural resources and prevent wildfires.

This year woodcutting maps will be available online at https://www.fs.usda.gov/main/fremont-winema/passes-permits/forestproducts under firewood permits or digitally from Avenza Maps at www.avenzamaps.com.

Permits and information on current conditions are available at Fremont-Winema National Forest offices. Generally offices are open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Purchasers are encouraged to call in advance to ensure permits are available at their nearest office.

BACK IN THYME

Highlighting Hair Rinses Part 1:

I found a very interesting article that fits todays generation of changing our hair colors or highlighting tones of hair! For centuries people have used rises to not only clean their hair but transform the tint of their tresses.

Rinses are simple to create, like making a cup of tea or a strong herbal infusion. RHUBARB HAIR LIGHTER:

This vegetable (not a fruit) belongs to the buckwheat (Polygonacene) family and originates from Mongolia. Use only the stalks in this recipe (the leaves are poisonous)

- 3 Fresh Rhubarb Stalks (Chopped)
- 1 Tbls Honey
- 2 Cup Water

Mix all in a small saucepan, cook over medium-heat. Bring to a boil, reduce heat. Simmer 30 minutes. Allow to cool completely, strain. Pour liquid into a clean container with a tight fitting lid.

To Use: Massage about 1/2 of the liquid through clean hair; cover with a warm towel or plastic wrap and leave on for at least 30 minutes. Rinse hair well and dry or style as usual.


The longer you leave the mix on your hair, the greater the lightening effects will be. You may need to repeat this weekly for significant color Change.

CHAMOMILE BLOND COCTAIL:

- 1 Tbls Fresh Lemon Juice




