HUNTING & FISHING REPORT

ANA RESERVOIR: hatchery rainbow trout

Ana Reservoir remains ice-free during the winter because of springs producing constant 60°F water. Trout and hybrids remain active during the winter months. The water level is currently 13 feet below full pool and is expected to remain so until spring. Anglers should be prepared for dirt/mud conditions during this time. Fish can be caught using bait, lures, and flies from shore or boats.

ANA RIVER: hatchery rainbow trout

Rainbow trout are active throughout the year in the river and anglers have been catching fish with bait, flies or lures.

CHICKAHOMINY RESERVOIR: trout

The reservoir is around a third full and covered in ice. Warmer weather has thinned out the ice and created rotten spots. Use caution on the ice. Ice fishing has been fair. Legal-sized rainbow trout were released in the reservoir in September.

DUNCAN RESERVOIR: rainbow trout

The ice at Duncan Reservoir was unsafe when checked on Jan 7. ODFW does not recommend ice fishing at Duncan Reservoir currently. Anglers wishing to ice fish can access Thompson Reservoir, which has safe ice. Anglers should use caution during first-ice conditions including: using the "buddy system," wearing a PFD in case of thin ice, carrying a throwrope, and using a heavy metal staff to check for thin-ice. Vexilar's Ice Fishing Today website has a quick 2-minute video describing how to be safe during early ice.

THOMPSON RESERVOIR: rainbow trout, largemouth bass

Access to the reservoir is not blocked by snow. Anglers wishing to ice fish can access the

reservoir by 4-wheel drive vehicles to either boat ramp. The ice was checked on Jan. 7 and is about 12-inches near the dam.

Fishing was slow during that time. Anglers should use caution during first-ice conditions including: using the "buddy system," wearing a PFD in case of thin ice, carrying a throw-rope, and using a heavy metal staff to check for thin-ice. Vexilar's Ice Fishing Today website has a quick 2-minute video describing how to be safe during early ice.

LAKE COUNTY HUNTING

All Waterfowl seasons are now closed.

Cougar hunting is open. Populations are healthy due to good habitat and prey base. If hunters can find a fresh cougar kill, calling within a ½ mile of that kill can be very effective. Mule deer herds are well above traditional winter areas due to a lack of snow and periods of extreme cold temperatures at lower elevations. Cougar hunters should focus on areas with deer concentrations and so far this winter those areas are between 5,800 and 6,800 feet.

Coyote numbers appear to be increasing throughout the county. Prey distress calls still appear to be effective, however the breeding season is fast approaching and effectiveness of coyote vocalizations will increase through March.

Upland Bird - California Quail and Chukar seasons run through the end of January. The California Quail hatch was good but the birds are most common on private land and hunters must get permission. Hunters are finding very few Chukar throughout the county. Seasons close Jan. 31

SUMMER LAKE WILDLIFE AREA

This section was updated on January 27, 2014

Parking permits are now required on all vehicles. Hunters get the permit free with the purchase of their annual hunting license.

Hunting success was very slow for ending of goose season during the past week. Weather conditions were unfavorable during the entire week. Ambitious hunters willing to hike to distant bird use areas and spending most of the day in the field enjoyed fair success. Casual hunters jump shooting or attempting to pass shoot close to access areas and roads saw very poor hunting success.

Weather conditions were mostly mild. Daytime high temperatures were in the high 40- low 50s while night time lows were in the low teens nearly all week. Skies were generally clear and winds were mostly still the entire week. Because of the low night temperatures, frozen conditions persisted and waterfowl were concentrated in refuge and sanctuary areas.

For the 16th week of the season, hunter participation (31 check-in) was down (-20.5%) from the same week of the season last year. Reported harvest (100.0% check-out) of 10 geese was down from the same week in 2012 when 12geese and 3 California quail were reported taken.

No California quail were reported taken last week. Last year, 3 quail were harvested.

The prospect for the upcoming week remains fair for QUAIL hunting. The season will end on Friday, January 31, 2014 DUCK, GOOSE, COOT AND SNIPE SEASONS ARE NOW CLOSED.

Weather conditions for the upcoming week are forecasted to be somewhat stormy for most of the entire week. (cont. next pg.) Chances of rain and snow are predicted. High temperatures are forecasted to be in the 40's and 50s and nighttime lows will be in the high 20s to low 30's. All hunters must have a free daily hunting permit in their possession and are required to check out at the end of the day. Self-serve permits are available in the Checking Station Lobby at Headquarters. Please read and follow instructions when obtaining permits.

Check-out boxes are found at each campground, Headquarters and major access areas. Please check the 2013-2014 Oregon Game Bird Regulations for daily bag and possession limits.

Federally approved non-toxic shot is required for all game bird hunting.

medium-sized shrubs with gray,
wooly hairs, or pubescence.
Rabbit Brush lacks the strong
sage odor and has narrow (linear), non-lobed leaves. Rabbit
Brush's more brightly, yellow
colored, disk flowers in showy
clusters of small heads, makes
it more identifiable. They become very conspicuous when

they bloom in the late summer.
The name "Chrysothamnus" is
Greek, meaning golden shrub.
The fruits are capped with
many bristles that aid in seed
dissemination.

There are two large and variable species of Rabbit Brush thriving throughout the sagebrush steppe. The most common is the gray Rabbit Brush (Chrysothamnus nauseosus). Nauseosus meaning "heavy scented". White or grayish wooly hairs densely cover the stems and leaves. This species often forms expansive populations in the high plains and on sandy soils.

The second is green Rabbit Brush (Chrysothamnus Viscidiflorus) which lacks wooly pubescence and thus appears greener. It has sticky, or viscid stems and flowers. Both species of Rabbit Brush often occur together. The plants provide poor quality browse for jackrabbits in spite of the common name; perhaps the rabbits hide in it rather than eat it. Deer, Antelope, and other range animals eat it very sparingly also. If anyone finds any use for it. I would be interested in learning more about it.


Get In The Game for a Safer Super Bowl

The NFL Super Bowl is known for its commercials almost as much as it is for the game itself. Of its wide viewing audience, about 18% will be youth under 21. If you child is watching, he or she will be exposed to a great deal of alcohol advertising. And if your kids are watching, you should be, too.

In recent years, alcohol companies have been increasing the number and variety of commercials featuring what kids love most in ads- cute animals, humor, fun music. These messages are getting through; recent surveys of middle and high school students reveal two of the five "most memorable" commercials to air during the Super Bowl were beer commercials. Research shows that the more youth are exposed to alcohol in advertising, the more likely they are to drink alcohol underage. And kids who start drinking before age 15 are **five times more likely** than those who wait to age 21 to have alcohol-related problems later in life, including alcoholism and involvement in alcohol-related violence and motor-vehicle crashes.

The good news for parents is research has also found that kids who are savvy about alcohol marketing drink less and feel encouraged to delay alcohol use until age 21. So use the Super Bowl as an opportunity to increase your child's awareness of the impact of alcohol marketing messages. The Drug-Free Action Alliance (DFAA) invites teens to participate in Big Bowl Vote 2014, a short survey giving students the chance to share their thoughts on their favorite Super Bowl ads. DFAA's goal is to help young people recognize how they are being targeted by advertising and to decode advertisers' underlying messages; DFAA summarizes these data to educate families, lawmakers and the media about the negative impact of alcohol advertising on youth. 


