

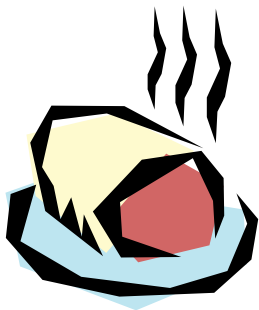

FREE DISCUSSION ABOUT URBAN-RURAL TENSIONS IN OREGON

The March 6 and 7 events are part of Oregon Humanities' statewide Conversation Project.

LAKEVIEW, Ore.—February 21, 2104—every state has a legacy of truths—stories residents tell to explain why things are how they are. When those truths conflict, as they inevitably do, the result is political, social, and cultural tension. In Oregon, tensions manifest themselves as wet versus dry, the valley versus the east side, and, perhaps most fundamental, urban versus rural. What are the ties that bind, or could bind, urban and rural communities to a common future?

This is the focus of "Toward One Oregon: Bridging Oregon's Urban and Rural Communities," a free conversation with Michael Hibbard and Bruce Weber, hosted by Lake County Libraries and sponsored by Oregon Humanities. **Lakeview's** conversation will be held on Wednesday, March 5 at 7 pm at the Main Library, 26 South G Street. **Paisley's** conversation will be held on Thursday, March 6 at 1 pm in the Paisley School Auditorium at 260 Green Street. **Christmas Valley's** conversation will be held on Thursday, March 6 at 7 pm in the Christmas Valley Boosters Hall at 86962 Aspen Lane.

Hibbard is a professor emeritus in the Department of Planning, Public Policy, and Management at the University of Oregon. His research focuses on community and regional development, with a special interest in the social impacts of economic change on small towns, indigenous communities, and rural regions.

Weber is a professor of agricultural and resource economics at Oregon State University and director of OSU's Rural Studies Program. He does applied research and outreach and teaches graduate and undergraduate courses on rural community economics and policy.

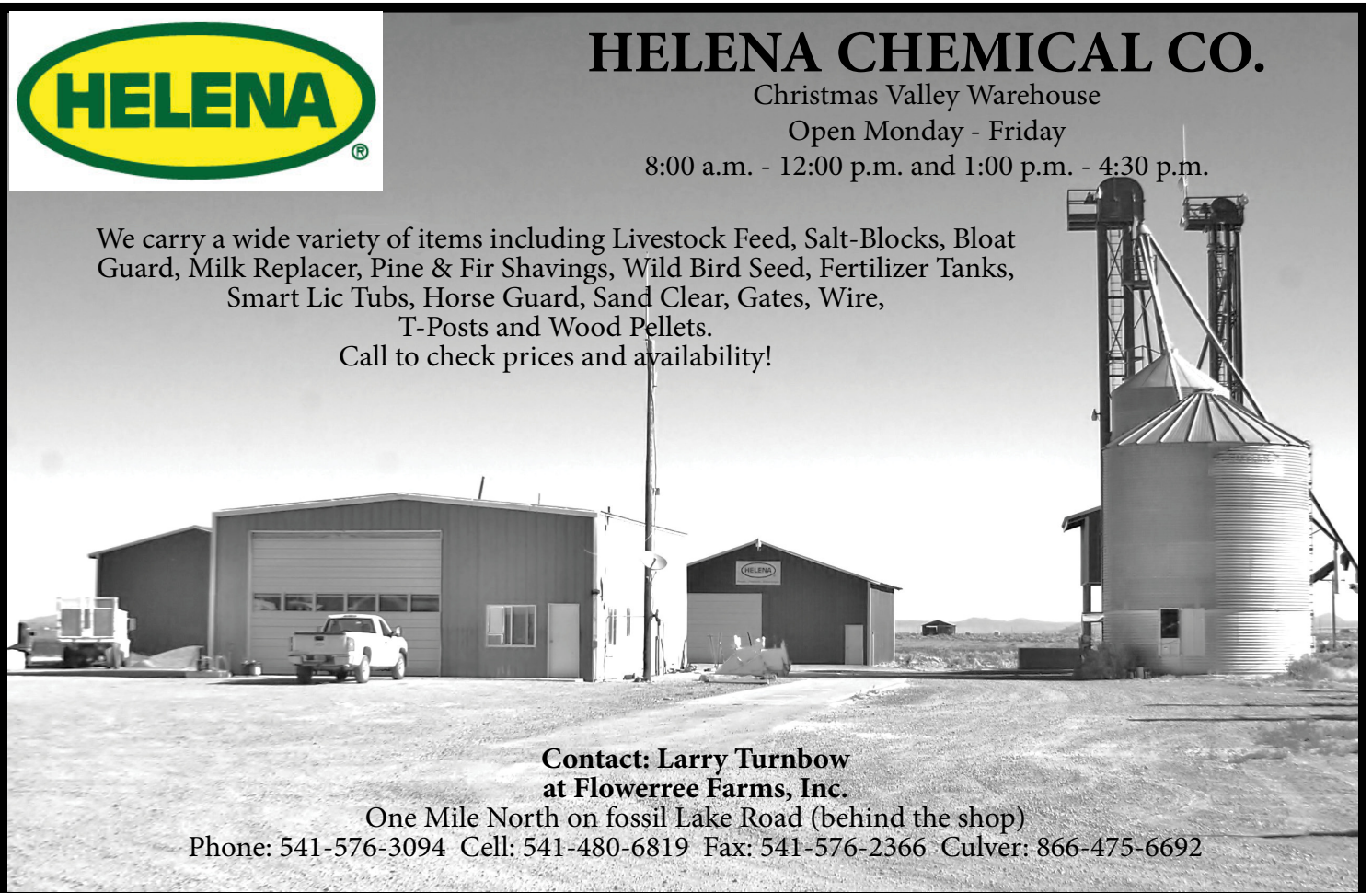

There are many contests that are done such as Parliamentary Procedure, Advanced Public Speaking, Sophomore Public Speaking, Beginning Public Speaking, Extemporaneous Speaking and FFA Creed Speaking.

The speeches are all based on agricultural related topics and are scored based on the written quality of the manuscript, presentation of the speech and a question/answer section.

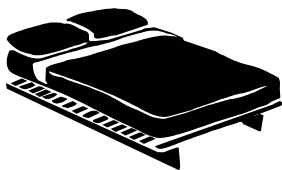

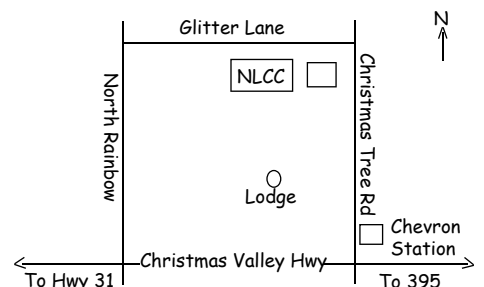
