Tri-county health surveys begin this week

<u>Lakeview, Oregon – February 15, 2019 – This week, the High Desert Rural Opioid Partnership will begin its survey of Lake, Klamath, and Modoc county residents as part of a community health assessment process.</u>

The High Desert Rural Opioid Partnership is working closely with the Hospital Council of Northwest Ohio and researchers at the University of Toledo to conduct the survey. Over the next two months, 3,600 Lake, Klamath, and Modoc county residents ages 25 to 75 will be randomly selected to participate in a survey. Residents of Lake, Klamath, and Modoc counties who are randomly selected are urged to complete and return the survey.


The anonymous survey asks participants to answer questions about perceptions and use of opiates. These answers will create a snapshot of the health of Lake, Klamath, and Modoc County adults. The results will guide many public and private agencies in their program planning over the next several years by identifying key health problems. The final community report will be available in the fall of 2019.

The High Desert Rural Opioid Partnership is composed of many public and private agencies that make up the public health system. The partners include Goose Lake Medical Services, Klamath Basin Behavioral Health, Klamath County Public Health, Lake County Public Health, Lake County Sheriff's Office, Lake Health Clinic, Lake District Recovery Center, Lake District Wellness Center-Prevention, Lakeview Disaster Unit, Modoc Medical Center, Outback Retirement Center, Sky Lakes Medical Center, Town of Lakeview, and Warner Mountain Medical Clinic.

This project is supported by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) as part of an award totaling \$200,000 with 3 percent financed with non-governmental sources. Cabbage AU Gratin

Ingredient List

- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb Head of green cabbage, cored and cut
- 2 Tbsp Butter
- 6 TBSP all-purpose flour
- 2 Cups milk or heavy cream
- ½ cup aged Gouda cheese, grated
- 1/2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- freshly-ground pepper, to taste Smoked paprika, to taste

Sea salt

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°

Cut up cabbage and cook in salted water until tender, drain. Make a sauce with the butter, flour, milk, and garlic. Fill a greased baking dish with alternate layers of cabbage and sauce. Sprinkle top layer with pepper and paprika. Cover with cheese and bake in a moderate oven for 20 minutes.

Lamb Stew with Turnips

Ingredient List

- 3 TBSP extra virgin olive oil, plus more for the roux
- 3 1/2 pounds boneless lamb shoulder, cut pieces

Kosher salt Pepper


- 2 small yellow onions, quartered
- 8 garlic cloves, crushed
- 6 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 cup dry white wine
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 4 cups water
- 3 small turnips, peeled and quartered
- 1/2 pound medium carrots, cut pieces
- 8 fingerling potatoes
- 3 tablespoons heavy cream

Directions

In a large dutch oven heat the 3 tablespoons of oil until shimmering. Season the lamb with salt and pepper. Working in batches, cook the lamb over moderate heat until browned all over, about 8-10 minutes per batch. Transfer to a large plate. Add the onions to the dutch oven and cook over moderate heat, stirring, until golden. Add in the garlic and cook, stirring, about 2 minutes; transfer to the plate.

Remove the dutch oven from the heat and add enough oil to make 6 tablespoons of fat. Whisk in the flour, then return to the heat. Add the wine and bring to a simmer over moderate heat, scraping the bottom of the dish. Stir in 4 cups of water along with the stock and whisk until smooth and simmering, then add the lamb and onion mixture and bring to a simmer. Cover and cook over moderately low heat, stirring occasionally, until the lamb is tender, about 1 hour and 45 minutes. Add the turnips, carrots and potatoes to the dutch oven and cook until tender, about 30 minutes. Stir in the heavy cream; season with salt and pepper. Serve.

BACK IN THYME

by Linda McCoslin

Highlighting Hair Rinses Part 2:

DARKENING HAIR RINSE: Rosemary and Thyme are traditional herbs for darkening color and keeping hair soft and silky. They also have natural antiseptic properties, which give an added bonus of improving your scalps health and keeping it free of dandruff. After several uses, you will notice the results. As with all these rinses and any herbal use. you will notice the effects over time.

- 1 Tbls Fresh Rosemary Leaves
- 1 Tbls Fresh Thyme Leaves

Place the herbs leaves in a ceramic or glass bowl and pour boiling water over them. Steep the leaves until liquid cools. Strain and pour into clean container.

To Use: After shampooing and conditioning your hair, pour herbal rinse over hair. Leave rinse in hair at least 30 minutes. Follow with a final rinse of 2 cups cool water and 1 Tablespoon apple cider vinegar.

<u>CALENDULA PETAL RINSE</u>: In the 16th century, European women used yellow or orange calendula flower petals to produce dye for their hair. A publication at the time, THE NEW HERBAL (1551), stated: "Some women used to make their hair yellow with flowers of the calendula plant, not being content with the natural color which God hath given them". Today, calendula petals feature in skin toner, creams and bath products, and continue to provide a wonderful highlighting rinse for both brunettes and blondes to enjoy.

- 1/4 cup Fresh Calendula Petals or 2 Tbls dried
- 2 Cups Boiling Water

Place petals in a large bowl and pour boiling water over them. Let mix cool completely, strain.

To Use: After shampoo and conditioning, pour rinse through hair

SAGE TEA RINSE: Sage probably works best of all herbs for darkening and toning hair. It also has strong anti bacterial properties for a clean and healthy scalp, and some people look to the herb to stimulate hair growth.

- 1/4 Cup Fresh Sage Leaves
- 2 cups Cold Water
- 2 Tsp Vodka or Witch Hazel

Gently tear sage leaves into small pieces and place them in a medium sized sauce pan. Add the COLD water to the pot and bring to a boil, then remove from heat. Let the fresh leaves steep for several hours. Strain off liquid and stir in Vodka or Witch Hazel to liquid. Pour into clean bottle or jar.

To Use: After shampoo, pour this rinse through hair and leave it in. **DO NOT RINSE OUT**. Dry and style hair as usual.
