Whole Wheat Bread

- 1 pkg yeast
- 2 cups milk
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup lukewarm water
- 1/4 cup molasses
- 6 TBSP Shortening

5 cups whole wheat flour Dissolve yeast in the water. Heat milk just to lukewarm, stir in molasses, sugar, shortening and the yeast. Add 2 cups whole wheat flour and the salt. Beat with wooden spoon. Add more flour and when to stiff to handle, turn on board sprinkled with the 1/2 cup white flour. Continue adding flour and kneading till dough is no longer sticky and is smooth and elastic. Put in greased bowl, turning around to get all dough greased. Cover and let rise in warm place till double in size. (about 2 1/2 hours) Divide into equal parts let rest 10 mins. form into loaves put in greased pans cover let rise about 50 mins bake in hot over (400°) about 20 to 25 mins.



Highlighting Hair Rinses Part 3:

<u>BLACKBERRY LEAF RINSE</u>: This rinse will gently enhance your hair color, deepening the color of dark hair and highlighting lighter shades. The green prickly leaves make a cleansing rinse that also helps treat dandruff. If you can't find fresh blackberry leaves, look for dried leaves in bulk at a natural food store or use an herbal tea made from blackberry leaves.

<u>RED HIBISCUS</u>: The dried petals create a strong, red tea to create a subtle red color.


<u>UBE:</u> Japanese root veg. also known as purple yam. Provides a vivid violet or purple color. You can purchase the powder online or at a natural food store.


