REMEMBERING OUR ELDERS PART 1

In researching my herb articles, mostly written by Elders, I have found a lack in the world around me, in our communities and families. Where are our elders? What place in our communities have we created for them? Who listens to their stories, hungering for the rich experiences they store in a lifetime of memories? What is a community without its wizened elders?

For centuries, in cultures around the world, elders were honored by their communities, entrusted with teaching traditions and ceremonies to the children. They were respected healers, herbalists, shaman, and midwives; They took care of the spiritual and physical needs of the community. In Council, the elders held the sacred space while the younger members listened with due respect. Often, the final decisions rested with them. These were the sages, the honored once. How things have changed.

We live in a culture that worships the young for their unbounded potential but devalues many of the elders and their rich store of experience. Worse yet our culture treats aging as an illness, a "Terminal illness at that. A large and profitable industry has grown up around keeping our elders out of sight, out of mind, segregated from the rest of society.

Our parents and grandparent are bundled off to homes for the elderly, often against their wishes; Once they are safely "stored," many are largely ignored. Though this is not true of every family or community, it is a growing trend. Just look at current statistics or, better yet, look in the community around you to see how visible seniors are in the community events, school programs, and family affairs. Sadly, the important role of elders in community life has been largely forgotten.

Even in the herbal community, where elders have long been honored for their sage advice and contributions, our aging parents and grandparents are overlooked to some degree. Many herb books have been written in the past couple of decades, but only one specifically addresses the needs of our elder population. An Elder's Herbal by David Hoffman. People over the age of 65 make up 13 percent of the overall population in the United States, Consume the greatest amount of medication, and require the most medical assistance, you would think that you would see more books and articles on the natural health and healing for that age group? But we don't - though there are certainly enough television commercials and magazine ads, articles and pharmaceutical medications that specifically target this age group. Aren't the elderly interested in natural remedies, preventive medicine, and self-care?

Its true, the needs of the elder are different from those of a younger person. Much like the plants in the garden at different seasons of their lives, our bodies and spirits reflect the needs of our cycles of life. As children, the herbs and herbal remedies, focus on growth, childhood illnesses, and foundational health. Child bearing adults needs change and focus on reproductive health, remedies for stress and anxiety, and digestive and liver problems. Health concerns for the elderly change also. Information on herbs and natural therapies for the elderly are widely available, but they are often overlooked and under utilized. Herbs that maintain life force and contribute to the keen mind, healthy heart, and good digestion have been supplanted by synthetic medications and pharmaceuticals.
