
The Giving Plate's



Our Mission, Our Story, Our Future

The Giving Plate opened its doors in Bend, OR in 2010, founded by Gary and Debra Kelso. Their Christ-centered passion was to serve the community during a poor economic time where many were struggling to make ends meet. Putting two cans of tuna and five loaves of bread on their empty warehouse shelves they dedicated the outcome to the Lord. Initially they thought helping 500 families would be amazing but within a few months they had registered that 500th family and began to realize the need was much bigger than they ever imagined. The need for food and youth services has continued to rise at an astounding rate.

Kid's Korner was founded in 2017 as Oregon's only public children's shopping style food pantry. The Kelso's brought a second one to Christmas Valley in the fall of 2020. They quickly learned that food is needed but realize there are





After serving the North Lake community out of a temporary facility since the fall of 2020, the Kelso's (founders) have kick-started the future of Kids Korner by purchasing a piece of land centrally located on Christmas Valley Highway. To further this vision, we will start with a phase one fenced courtyard which will include a mobile bus pantry, outdoor activities including a bounce house and seating. This will allow our children a safe, fun, welcoming place to gather. In the effort to continue services while this project is being developed, the Kelso's will be hosting Kid's Korner out of their garage with activities in the yard on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Saturdays of each month from 11:00-2:00 at 87539 Spruce Lane.

BUDGET COMMITTEE MEMBERS NEEDED

Most local governments in Oregon, from the smallest Cemetery district to the largest city, must prepare and adopt an annual budget. Schools, counties, cities, rural fire protection districts, and most special districts are all subject to the same budget provisions.

Each district forms a Budget Committee made of the Districts board members and an equal number of Appointed electors. The appointed electors must meet the following guidelines:

Electors are registered voters in the district. Cannot be officers, agents or employees.

All members have the same authority and are appointed for staggered 3-year terms.

If the district can't fill all appointed members, the Committee can be fewer.

The remodel is set to begin soon, and the dental office is scheduled to open by this Summer.

Several community members met at the Ranch Hand on February 16th, 2022 to discuss forming a Christmas Valley History Center. Lu Damerval, the group leader, approached the Christmas Valley Park and Recreation District about sponsoring the History Center.

The group is asking the community to become involved by submitting any of the old stories of community members or memorabilia that they may have about the Christmas Valley area.

Ellen Shaver, a group member, says, "In my short time of living here, I've found that Christmas Valley has a vast history and its origins date back to Spanish Conquistadors, some mining expeditions and a couple of Native American tribes using the area to hunt on just to the East of the area. The township of Lake was formed decades before the CV area seems to have been formed along Millican Road towards Sink Road and Christmas Valley was formed years later after Lake sort of disbanded."

The group is in the beginning stages and their goal is to have an actual Christmas Valley History Center building to showcase the area's history, stories and memorabilia.

I am the mother of seven grown children and have six grandchildren.

My position as Office Manager of Christmas Valley Park and Recreation District and as Office Manager of North Lake Health District and as a North Lake Planning Commissioner has enabled me to become familiar with some of the problems that face Lake County residents.

My 30 years of Risk Management and Contract Administration for Federal, State, municipality, and private sector land use, hazardous waste clean up and remediation, and handling complex commercial insurance claims, along with managing my own residential rental, logging, and farm/ranching businesses gives me the knowledge and experience for the decisions required for county government.

I have always been civic minded and a solution seeker. I have been a 4-H leader, Girl Scout leader, Little League board member and have been a member of Sheriff's Posse and Search and Rescue.

I was part of a grass roots movement to allow for the funding of public charter schools in the State of Oregon. I organized a meeting with the local pear growers to educate the regional heads of the National Crop Insurance program; subsequently the classifications were changed.

I am hard-working and I go the extra mile to get things accomplished. I will be a strong advocate and a strong voice for ALL the residents of Lake County. My pledge to Lake County is to be dependable, to make informed decisions and to take action and follow through on those decisions and to put my heart into every effort at being a loyal and trusted County Commissioner for ALL of Lake County.
