LA PINE COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER SLATED TO RECEIVE OVER \$3,000,000

FROM CONGRESSIONALLY DIRECTED SPENDING APPROPRIATIONS FOR WELLNESS CENTER PROJECT

LA PINE, Oregon, 8/12/2022— La Pine Community Health Center (LCHC) has been included in the draft Senate Labor, Health and Human Services (LHHS) Appropriations bill, for \$3,088,100 from Congress for the Wellness Center Project which breaks ground in Spring 2023.

The project includes a new, 27,000 square foot building that is slated to open in 2024, and the remodel of current offices, and furniture and equipment for both. The project as a whole allows for the addition of dental services, diagnostic imaging such as CT scans, ultrasound and mammograms, expansion of mental health services and space for four more primary care providers who will be able to care for an additional, combined 4,600 patients.

The new building is estimated at \$10,000,000, half of which has already been secured through grants, Oregon Legislative funding, and reserve funds. The remodel of current offices and the purchase of furniture and equipment for both the new building and remodeled area will be fully funded by this appropriations bill if it is passed by Congress.

Charla DeHate, CEO stated, "We are thrilled and honored that the La Pine CHC Wellness Center Project has been selected for Congressionally Directed Spending appropriation. This project will increase access to necessary healthcare services for the residents of South Deschutes County and the surrounding areas of North Klamath and Northwest Lake Counties. Thank you to Senators Ron Wyden and Jeff Merkley for their support and commitment!"





Planned Merger of Pacific Crest FCU and Klamath Public Employees FCU Announced

Move seen as a positive growth opportunity for the region

KLAMATH / LAKE COUNTIES, OR: The boards of Pacific Crest Federal Credit Union and Klamath Public Employees Federal Credit Union have recently voted on resolutions of intent to merge.

"Credit Unions are member owned cooperatives, and we exist to serve our members. Joining forces is a step forward for our members and our region. As the only two financial institutions head-quartered in Klamath County, this strategic partnership will allow us to better serve the needs of the Klamath Basin and surrounding area," said Chad Olney, CEO of Pacific Crest FCU. "Our two Credit Unions already enjoy a cooperative relationship and a common culture, wholeheartedly embracing the credit union philosophy of people helping people."

The merger will be subject to a lengthy regulatory process that includes a vote by the membership of KPEFCU. Under the planned merger, members of both credit unions will benefit from an anticipated expansion of services and an expanded number of branch locations with the branches of both organizations remaining open after the merger. Kevin Dearing, Klamath Public's CEO pointed out "This merger is about doing what is best for our members, and assuring that our region continues to have local decisions made by local people who live and work here. Our members will continue to be able to walk in and talk with people they know and trust."

Pacific Crest FCU serves 19,000 members in Klamath, Lake, Modoc, and Siskiyou Counties and currently holds \$250 million in assets. 

Several of the properties in the Christmas Valley township have utility easements for the **Christmas Valley** Water District.

When you have a utility easement on your property, the utility company/Water District may have a range of legal rights.

A few restrictions you might face include:

- Utility company/Water District access without your approval.
- Utility company/Water District may restrict your use of the easement when your use can harm underground water mains, valves, water meters, and the like.
- Restrictions on physical alterations: You may want to make an improvement to a certain section of your property. But the utility easement may prevent certain upgrades, such as erecting a fence or a gate.
- Vegetation restrictions: The utility company may require regular access to a particular area and constantly tear up your garden. Additionally, many utility easements limit the planting of major trees in a specified area.

If you're considering purchasing a property with a utility easement, take some time to research the local laws and regulations.

LIGHTNING CONTINUES ACROSS KLAMATH AND LAKE COUNTIES

LAKEVIEW, Ore. - August 10, 2022 — Lightning across the SCOFMP area continued for the second week in a row. Monday evening's storm sparked 21 confirmed fires. Although lightning activity was heavy, much of the storm came with rain, keeping many of the new starts less than a tenth of an acre.

The largest fire this week is the Juniper fire southwest of Alkali Lake, which is 7.5 acres. Single Engine Air Tanker (SEAT) planes were able to get on scene early and box the fire in giving ground resources extra time to arrive on scene. Crews are working on mopping up the Juniper fire. As of this morning, two new incidents have been reported. We are expecting more starts throughout the day.

Today, a Red Flag warning and a fire weather watch is in effect for strong gusty winds and low relative humidity on critically dry vegetation, which will greatly increase the spread potential of any new and existing fires.

Coordination within the partnership area has been working well and SCOFMP fire crews have worked hard through these storms. We have safely and effectively responded to almost 50 confirmed incidents since July 31st.

As a reminder to the public fire danger remains extreme despite scattered rain showers. Fuels will dry out quickly with the increasing heat and wind. Private debris pile burning continues to be prohibited and public use restrictions remain in effect. Vigilant fire safety is required to prevent fires and protect our communities!





Children's Food Relief Outreach

When we arrived in Christmas Valley in July 2020, we did not come here thinking we could make a difference but if it happened we would be blessed. The confirmation story of why we decided to move here was solely God orchestrated. We brought a supplemental program from our main ministry in Bend, The Giving Plate in hopes to get to know youth and their parents all while serving those who could use some help. Our behind the scenes work has overshadowed the kid's food pantry and with that we saw how much need is truly out here. Our hearts were breaking and we felt we needed to do more so we set out to get counsel, seek the history of what worked and what didn't, speak with leaders in the community, elders in our church, network with other local non-profits, facilitate non-profit meet and greets with foundations, etc. For those that have followed Kid's Korner know that our bigger vision was to build a youth center that offered food, activities, showers and resources to other assistance. When purchasing a commercial lot, we were hopeful to build on it but were told the lot was too small and the plans wouldn't work according to county codes. There have been so many hurdles this year. Too many to list. We prayed for clarity and the clarity has come. Not in how we hoped but we recognize what we need to do.

The community support has been verbally amazing but it will take a village to make anything bigger out here happen if it does. There are so many kids with so much potential to be difference makers in their own life and the world if given the chance. Some of them need a hand up or just to be seen. Plus, there's much richness to be had to sit and share a meal with those who are not of our faith, status, wealth (or lack of), political affiliation, culture, within our circle of friends and family. The diversity is great here in Christmas Valley. We want to be a part of a solution in a community that puts high value on the well-being of our children. Where we collectively are not allowing children to go to bed hungry, get bullied, be bullies, be looked away from or down on.

All in all, we've given our all while pushing though our own health challenges and now the health issues must be addressed. As long as we are able, we will continue to assist behind the scenes with the funds available. We've done much of that this last year especially and do not want to give up the opportunities to help families with emergency needs.

Everyone in the North Lake region is welcome to visit our food bank, The Giving Plate in Bend at: 1235 SE 3rd St. Thursday and Friday 10-4 and Saturday 10-2. One block north of Fred Meyer. Kids Korner bags are available for all kids there as well. When we have events there or here, we will be sure to advertise them for those who may be interested.

In time, we will assess the future of the lot. Our last day there for 2022 will be August 20th with free ice cream sundaes for all! In the coming months, we hope to work with the county and find out what it is they will allow on this commercial lot.

To whom it may concern,

This is Notice regarding citation# LC13316.1 Cara Lee Jean, also spelled cara- lee jean: tompkins, the living, breathing, flesh and blood, natural woman, sent a lawful "Refusal for Cause" stating plainly across the citation in red ink: "Refused for cause, timely, without dishonor and without recourse to Me." The presentment "Refused for Cause" was sent via certified mail by Me on July 11th 2022 to officer Hector Alvarado and was DISHONORED via silence which is presumed acquiescence in the matter. The Notice of the presentment that was sent to the Lake County Circuit Court was also DISHONORED by the court by disregarding the proof of presentment by proceeding with Judgement and Conviction without question or correction of the cause of refusal.

The presentment "Refused for Cause" was Actual Notice to both the citing officer and the court that there was a JUST DEFECT IN THE LEGAL AND LAWFUL PROCESS (the citation/complaint) therefore it MUST be corrected before proceeding forward on the matter. This was not done.

"Take Notice": I, cara-lee jean: tompkins, am rebutting the identity I was presumed to be in reference to citation # LC13316. I, the natural woman do not accept responsibility for the legal fiction in this matter, or any other matter thereof. The matter regarding the citation is refused, for mistaken identity and lack of jurisdiction of my natural person. I have never placed myself in contract in any way shape or form to allow the citation to be enforceable. These matters MUST be corrected FIRST before action can proceed and before Judgement and Conviction can be lawful.

HONOR AND DISHONOR

This is the most important aspect of the law. In law, "Honor" or "Dishonor" is a process. It is what is done in response to a presentment. Throughout the entire process, you MUST be in honor. This applies to everything you do in the lawful and legal process. To act with dishonor toward the other person IS THE HIGHEST FORM OF TRANSGRESSION IN ANY SYSTEM OF LAW.

There are three ways to Honor a presentment: after Party "AB" makes a presentment, Party "CD" does one of the following:

- Accord and Satisfaction: Party "CD" Honors by accepting the presentment without recourse, and then satisfies whatever is demanded in the presentment.
- Conditional Acceptance: Party "CD" Honors by accepting the presentment but with conditions. Effectively that is a counter offer from "CD" to "AB" ("AB" would then accept the counter offer as a new presentment from "CD".
- 3. Rejection without Dishonor: "CD" rejects the presentment because it is defective.

There are two ways to Dishonor a presentment:

- Argument: Party "CD" rejects (dishonors) the bill. There is no basis for rejecting the bill; the
 arguments have no relevancy to the presentment.
- Silence: Party "CD" simply does not respond to the presentment, but remains silent. The presentment is thus dishonored, and is regarded as acquiescence.

The "FAILURE TO APPEAR" is UNLAWFUL. The Court or its officers cannot lawfully deprive me of my Rights by disregarding the lawful and legal presentment and NOTICE of the presentment that was sent by Me. If there were any questions regarding the document that was presented, lawful and legal correspondence should have been sent to the mailing address on record for Me. I did not, and have not, as of this date procured ANY correspondence regarding the presentment I sent; therefore, it was DISHONORED by the court and the citing officer, of which it was presumed acquiescence in the matter. Let it be reminded to everyone involved, ignorance of the law is no excuse, especially for those who are sworn to uphold the law:

"It is a crime for one or more persons acting under color of law willfully to deprive or conspire to deprive another person of any RIGHT protected by the Constitution or law of the United States." 18 U.S.C. 241, 242

"Clerk is to file: Whoever being a clerk of a district court of the United States, willfully refuses or neglects to make or forward any report, certificate, statement, or document as required by law, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than one year or both." 18 U.S.C. 2076

The Circuit Court of Lake County has acted dishonorably by unlawfully coming to Judgement and Conviction when there was a refusal for cause and the issue was not corrected before any further action could be taken. I DEMAND THAT THIS DISHONORABLE ACT BE CORRECTED!

I am NOT: CARA L. TOMPKINS, CARA L.J. TOMPKINS, CARA TOMPKINS, or any other variation that would recognize Me as the estate trust, legal fiction of a corporation, or any fictitious entity that was bonded and or contracted without my consent to "seem like" Me by the United States Corporation via registration of a Birth Certificate by my mom and dad, that was conducted and executed without FULL DISCLOSURE to them.

I am NOT a legal entity. Any further correspondence regarding this matter, or any other matter thereafter **MUST reflect this UNDERSTANDING** by properly addressing Me by my true and natural name given by my mom and dad, so that any official, officer or clerk of the court UNDERSTANDS that they are corresponding with the living, natural woman, the American National, a citizen of one of the many States, and NOT the legal entity.

I voluntarily choose to comply with the Supreme Law of the Land, which serves to bring harmony to society, but no such laws, nor their enforcers, have any authority over Me. I am not of subject status, and therefore do not consent to any jurisdiction that claims authority over my inalienable GOD given Rights that are established and protected by the Constitution of the united States of America.

Consistent with the eternal tradition of natural Common Law, unless I have harmed or violated someone or their property, I have committed no crime, and am therefore not subject to any penalty.

I act in accordance with the following U.S. Supreme Court case:

Hale v. Henkel, 201 U.S. 32 at 47

"The Individual may stand upon his Constitutional Rights as a citizen. He is entitled to carry on his private business in his own way. His power to contract is unlimited. He owes no such duty (to submit his or her books and papers for and examination) to the State, since he receives nothing therefrom, beyond the protection of his life and property. "Take NOTICE" that I revoke, cancel, and make void, ab initio, my signature on any and all contracts, agreements, forms, or any instrument which may be construed in any way to give any agency or department of any federal or state government authority, venue, or jurisdiction over Me.

TOMPKINS or any variation that addresses a fictitious entity, I will, with OVERSTANDING, lawfully disregard anything within WITHOUT DISHONOR to Me, as Notice was lawfully given, that as so written, the name is not in reference to Me, the natural person, and therefore, will not and cannot be held liable for anything thereof.
