

frequently. Over time, you don't do them automatically because they become part of your subconscious mind. Habits have 3 parts:

- Cue: a trigger that initiates action
- Routine: the action you do
- Reward: your benefit from doing the action

For example, one habit that we've all developed is brushing our teeth. Bad breath or bedtime cues us to perform the action. The reward is our mouths feeling minty

To create a new habit, identify a cue, routine, and reward. Then repeat action daily for about a month. For example, if you want to start doing yoga every day, place a yoga mat next to your bed. You'll feel rewarded by the relaxation you feel in your body. Soon, you'll want to do yoga every day. It won't feel like hard work anymore.

Which habits matter? A holistic approach to your habits and lifestyle will have the biggest impact. I recommend focusing on your sleep, stress, nutrition, movement, and mindset.

Studies are now confirming that without restorative sleep, you will be in a constant state of deficiency, caloric intake is higher with more sugar and salt cravings, body repair and detoxification is impacted and ideal health is impossible to achieve even with the perfect diet and exercise program.

> Here's how to change your habits to improve your sleep today:

- Go to bed at the same time each night
- Keep your phone out of your bedroom
- Reduce screen time 1-hour before bed

Managing stress is the second foundation in achieving ultimate health. Most of us spend much of day in a fight, flight or freeze response which in turn influences every aspect of our health. With the body in a constant state of cortisol overload, it is virtually impossible to optimize health even with a whole food diet and a consistent exercise program. During this phase of recovery, sleep plays a crucial role in supporting our stress response and the focus on food and exercise become the medicine to support

Here's how to change your habtoday:

Reduce your interactions with takers and negative people. If you can, block them entirely.

Reduce stimulants such as coffee and sugar that increase low-level stress all day.

Turn off work notifications in the evenings. That expense report can wait.

With improved quality and quantity of sleep as well as a new relationship with stress established, you can then fully receive all the benefits from an individualized nutrition program. At this point, discussion about elimination diets, detoxification programs, intermittent fasting etc. is relevant, not before this point.

Here's how to update your nutrition habits for big impact:

Eat small, nutrient-balanced meals every 3-4 hours. Balanced meals include lots of protein, fats, fruits and vegetables. They can also include carbs and sweets (in moderation).

Replace soda with sparkling water. All of the fizz, none of the empty calories.

Consult a healthcare professional to determine if you need any vitamins or supplements.

High-intensity workouts long-distance running programs yield incredible benefits but only with the other pillars balanced. Pushing the body before often results in further health declines and possible injury. With sleep improvements, stress supports in place and your individualized nutrition requirements intact your ideal exercise program will reveal itself.

Here are 3 easy habits to start moving more in 2022:

- Take a 10-minute walk break every day.
- Stretch when you get out of







Had it been up to me, my hay barn would have burned down while I slept unaware of any disaster, and then even if I had known about it, I don't know what I could have done. After the fire was all over, I realized I hadn't even offered hospitality to those working, no coffee, sandwiches, water; all things my mother would have upbraided me for having forgotten.

Long ago both of us volunteered a lot until we were burned out and other circumstances, like age and being away from home all changed our ability to respond. Why people won't volunteer is a favorite rant of mine. However, I remember the personal sacrifice, the meals not cooked, the times I forgot to gas up before I went on a call, the fatigue of volunteering all night and working the next day, the cost of maintaining your own training, the cost of time away from home and family for training in distant locations... etcetera that is not paid for.

On the 16th of December Jo Jo didn't hesitate to call in the fire before it got too big and out of control. The fire department's response saved the hay barn with minimal structural damage. They worked all night, into the next day, and came and checked on it repeatedly. Please add your personal thanks to these firefighters the next time you see them.

Thank you to firefighters: Chad Brown, Mike Clark, Steve Hilger, Paige Pline, Josh Buzzell, and Dino Aspiranti. Thank you Paige for fast thinking to call Dinsdale's crew for help.





QUESTION: Shall North Lake Emergency Services District be formed with permanent tax rate of \$2.64/\$1,000 of assessed value beginning FY 2022-23?

SUMMARY: This measure would create a taxing district authorized by ORS chapter 478 to provide emergency medical services to the area served by North Lake County EMS, currently a non-profit, volunteer organization. The measure also would approve a property tax levy of \$2.64 per \$1,000 of assessed value to provide a source of permanent operating revenue for the district.

The district would be governed by a five-member Board of Directors elected at large. The purpose of the emergency services district will be to provide a source of stable funding to provide emergency medical (EMS) services and pre-hospital care; upgrade and maintain buildings, vehicles and equipment; provide regular training and education for staff; add between two and three additional EMTs; and provide competitive compensation to attract and retain employees. A home with an assessed value of \$100,000 would pay approximately \$264 a year.

Linnaeus named the genus in 1753. Artemis was Apollo's twin sister and daughter of Zeus and Leto. She was equal or like the Greek goddess Diana. The Greek goddess, Diana was goddess of the Moon, woods, and the wild.

Greek legend states that she derived so much benefit from these plants that the species was named after her.

Artemesia Frigida is a perennial with a woody base. The stems are covered in lobed grey-green leaves which are covered in silver flower heads and lined with grey- while walking the creek as well. green, brownish fur. Self pollinating hermaphrodite flowers. See ya next article. Very aromatic, strong citronellalike smelling plant. This plant is a strong seed producer.

Hi guys n gals in and around From various tribes of North Christmas Valley area. I am go- America. It is used medicinally for coughs, colds, wounds, and ert herb found in the dried up heartburn by the Black Foot tribe. Cree people use it for headache and fever and the Tewa people took ti for gastritis. Zuni people use it as an infusion for colds, sprigs of the plant and corn ears were also used by female dancers in a dramatic dance. Sprigs of this plant were also dipped in water and plated with corn for more abundant crops. It is also a wild animal forage and erosion control in landscaping.

> Artemisa Frigida likes poor to semi-fertile soil that is dry well drained and in full sun. It does not like moist soils.

> It may be used as an antispasmodic, deodorant, disinfectant, poultice, stimulant, stomachic, vermifuge, for women's complaints, dye, essential oils, and bug repellent and a non-predatory bug protector.

> Wow guys, there is a plant with a lot of potential that you spot on a walk. Please folks be considerate to you forest. These plants are essential forage for all sorts of our wild herbivores.






