## North Lake High School Cowboys and Cowgirls Basketball Season Finale

*Lots of excitement this past weekend in the High School basketball world.*

Both the girls and the varsity boys of North Lake High made it to Districts with a chance to advance to State, with the girls playing favored Rogue Valley on Friday, followed by a must-win game Saturday against Chiloquin.

Friday's game was hotly contested as the girls came out firing against a strong Hawks team, led by #21 center, Emma Bischoff. The Cowgirls have not been able to solve her yet, but they had her contained in the first two quarters. Rogue Valley came out blazing in the second half and, though we tried to hang with them, the Hawks proved to be too much for us, winning a surprisingly close game by four points.

Saturday was more of the same against Chiloquin, and minus two players, the girls hung tough but ultimately lost a

heartbreaker by two points at the buzzer.

For the boys, it was a win-or-go-home situation. On Friday, we drew the Prospect High Cougars, a spirited team with skilled outside shooters and a tall power forward. The game was possibly the most exciting one to date as the Cowboys jumped out to a lead and held it to the middle of the fourth quarter. With three minutes remaining, the Cougars turned up the volume and the pressure, going on a 7-0 run to forge ahead by two points. The lead seesawed back and forth through the final three minutes of the game, and with the score

knotted at 46-46, Cowboys forward Noah Roth drew a two-shot foul with 10.2 seconds on the clock. He calmly sank them both to go up by a basket. The Cougars inbounded the ball and raced toward the perimeter near their basket, threw up a desperation shot that bounced off the rim, and when the ball came down, a tangle of players struggled for possession, the ball kicking out to a white-shirted Cowboys player, and the clock promptly ticked off its last second.

Saturday's game for the boys was against Crosspoint, and we came out flat, losing by double-digits in a game that we were never really in.

The Cowboys and Cowgirls ended their seasons on the same day ahead of a long bus ride home.

# The 19th Amendment Did Not Guarantee All Women the Right to Vote

With the certification of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution on August 26, 1920, women secured the right to vote after a decades-long fight. "The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex," it reads.

But while the passage of the 19th Amendment enabled most white women to vote, that wasn't the case for many women of color.

"For Black women, their votes weren't lifted by that tide in the South," Christina Rivers, associate professor of political science at DePaul University, says. "Their votes were suppressed solely on the basis of race."

Also prevented from voting: Native Americans—both men and women—did not gain the right to vote until the Snyder Act of 1924, four years after the ratification of the 19th Amendment and more than 50 years after the passage of the 15th Amendment. Even then, some Western states, including Arizona, New Mexico and Utah, didn't grant Native Americans the right to vote until the 1940s and '50s. It wasn't until the Cable Act of 1922 that women were allowed to keep their citizenship—and gain the right to vote—if they were married to an immigrant (who had to be eligible to become a U.S. citizen).

In Puerto Rico, literate women won the right to vote in 1929,

but it wasn't until 1935 that all women were given that right. And Asian American immigrant women were denied the right to vote until 1952 when the Immigration and Nationality Act allowed them to become citizens.

But even with the passage of these amendments and acts, a number of nefarious methods were used to keep segments of the population from voting. Most of these measures targeted Black Americans in the Jim Crow South, but Latinx, Native American and Asian Americans also faced obstacles to voting in the Southwest and West.

"When you combine literacy tests, invasive registration forms, interpretation tests, poll taxes and outright violence, this kept Black voting registration percentages down to the single digits in most of the Confederate South," Rivers says.

In fact, according to Pearl Dowe, professor of political science and African American studies at Emory University, efforts to legalize the right to vote were fraught with racism and division stemming back to the abolitionist movement.

"The biracial coalition that formed during abolition was very tenuous and eventually fractured due to conflicts about what should the status of freed Blacks be," she says. "This was often based on whites having conflicting attitudes about the humanity

of Blacks and if they were equal to whites. These issues and divides continued into the suffrage movement."

And those divides didn't stop with the 19th Amendment's passage. In addition to threats, intimidation, harassment, beatings and murders, other devices, such as literacy tests, were implemented not only in the Jim Crow South, but also in some other states including Connecticut, and designed specifically to deny Black people and immigrants from voting.

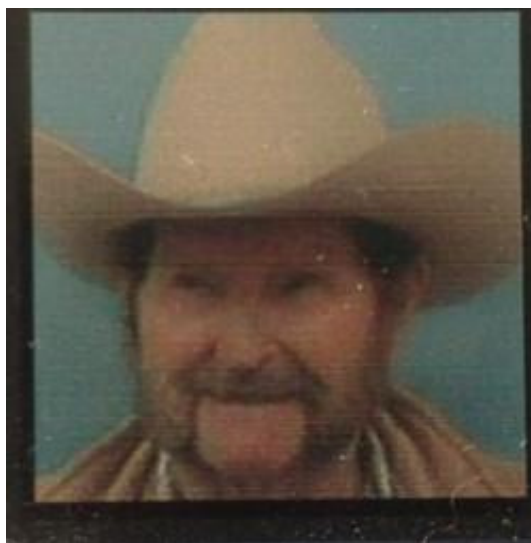
Administered and interpreted arbitrarily, registrars could ask citizens test questions at their discretion and also had the authority to pass or fail applicants with no explanation. The practice didn't end in some states until the passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Related to literacy tests were interpretation tests, which weren't struck down by the courts until the late 1950s on the grounds they were too arbitrary. According to Rivers, an interpretation test would involve transcribing or translating a passage of a complicated piece of writing—usually legalese from a state constitution. "They were designed to be very difficult to pass," Rivers says.

It wasn't until 45 years after the 19th Amendment became law, with the passage of the Voting Rights Act, that all women were free to vote.

## Film submissions open for Klamath Independent Film Festival

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore. – Klamath Film, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that promotes filmmaking in the Klamath Basin, is now accepting film submissions for the 10th annual Klamath Independent Film Festival (KIFF) through June 1.

The festival, scheduled to take place Sept. 16-18 at the Ross Ragland Theater in Klamath Falls and simultaneously presented via livestream and on-demand, is entering its tenth year. Dubbed “the premiere Oregon-centric film festival,” KIFF is the only film festival that exclusively showcases independent films made-in-Oregon, along with submissions from bordering California counties Siskiyou and Modoc.

Festival submissions are split into six categories based on geographic location as northern or southern Oregon, designated as either feature films (40 minutes or longer), shorts (under 40 minutes), and K-12 youth films. K-12 films should be no longer than five minutes. As with 2021’s festival, prize money totaling \$5,000 will be divided among the six categories.

Any film completed no later than Jan. 1, 2021 and is made predominantly in Oregon or by an Oregon resident filmmaker is eligible to submit for consideration. Film selections for KIFF will be announced in mid-July. Continuing a popular tradition, award-winning films from the six categories will receive a one-of-a-kind art piece trophy custom carved by the Southern Cascade Woodcrafters Guild along with a cash prize.

The festival is a popular draw for filmmakers and film fans from across the Pacific Northwest to Klamath Falls for several days of films and social activities. Since 2020 due to COVID-19 related crowd restrictions the festival has also been at the forefront of virtual festival structure, presenting KIFF in a hybrid format by livestreaming all on-stage activities and presenting every film along with an exclusive director Q&A on-demand for a limited time.

The festival has grown by leaps and bounds since its early days, established initially in 2013 one year after Klamath Film’s founding as little more than a means for members to showcase their own projects locally. The festival has grown in popularity and volume, now a three-day nationally recognized celebration of Oregon filmmaking. In recent years an opening night gala and street fair have been added to the schedule, along with a variety of social gatherings. In 2020 after the pandemic began KIFF gained further notoriety as the only film festival nationwide able to welcome an in-theater audience.

Filmmakers may submit up to two films for KIFF at <https://filmfreeway.com/klamathfilm>. There is a \$20 submission cost, but fee waivers will be provided to all those that request one. Youth K-12 film category submissions are free. Filmmakers may submit their films from Feb. 1 through June 1.

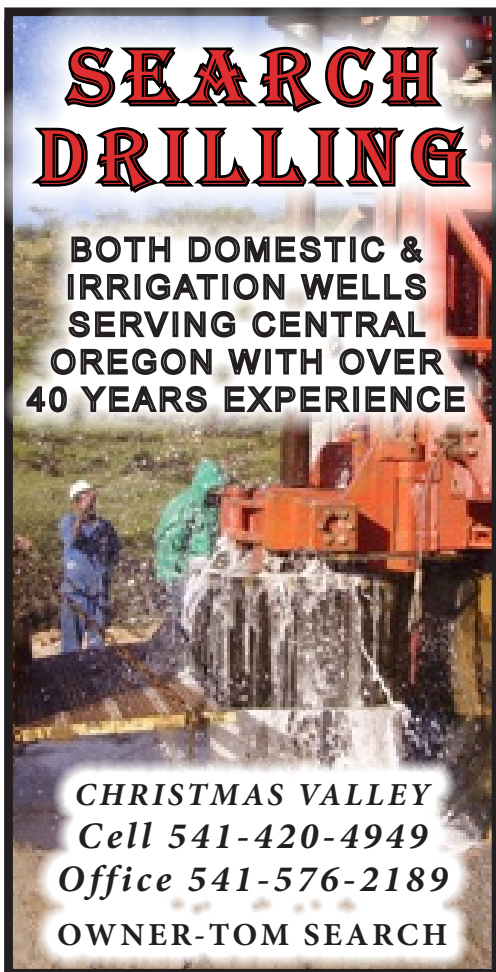

**Lake County**  
**ORDINANCE 39**  
**CAMPING**

**39.010 – PURPOSE**

The purpose of this article is to establish standards for camping on private property, which is allowed in all zones, including inside Urban Growth Boundaries.

Camping is the occupancy of private property within a tent, tent-trailer, shelter (not larger than 100 square feet), vehicle, or recreational vehicle not within an authorized/designated camping facility.

Camping on public or private property beyond the time limits described in this section is prohibited. Hunters with a current hunting license during an Oregon Dept. of Fish and Wildlife sanctioned hunting season may apply for extensions to the time limit.

- A. Yearlong hunting permits (i.e., cougar permits) do not grant yearlong camping privileges. Extensions to the time limits must be applied for when seeking camping permits.

**39.020 – STANDARDS**

- A. Camping on private property is allowed for up to twenty-one (21) days in any six (6) month period. No permit is required for the first seven (7) days. A permit is required for any stay between eight (8) and (21) days and must be posted at the property entrance for the duration of the stay. A minimum of fourteen (14) days is required between camping stays. The total number of days counted is per all contiguous property under the same ownership.

- a. Camping on multiple properties is still limited to twenty-one (21) days in any six (6) month period.

- B. Camping is limited to the property owner or those who have written permission from the property owner.

Outside of Urban Growth Boundaries, no more than a total of two (2) vehicles, trailers with tow vehicles, or tents and a maximum of twelve (12) people are allowed when a permit is required. Inside Urban Growth Boundaries, no more than one (1) vehicle, trailer with tow vehicle or tent and a maximum of four (4) people are allowed when a permit is required.

- C. Sewage disposal requires the following when a permit is required:
- a. Porta Pot, or Pit Privy (outhouse) which requires a septic evaluation prior to installation.
- b. Gray water disposal sump or recycled gray water.

Where there is a public sewer system, no connection is allowed when camping.

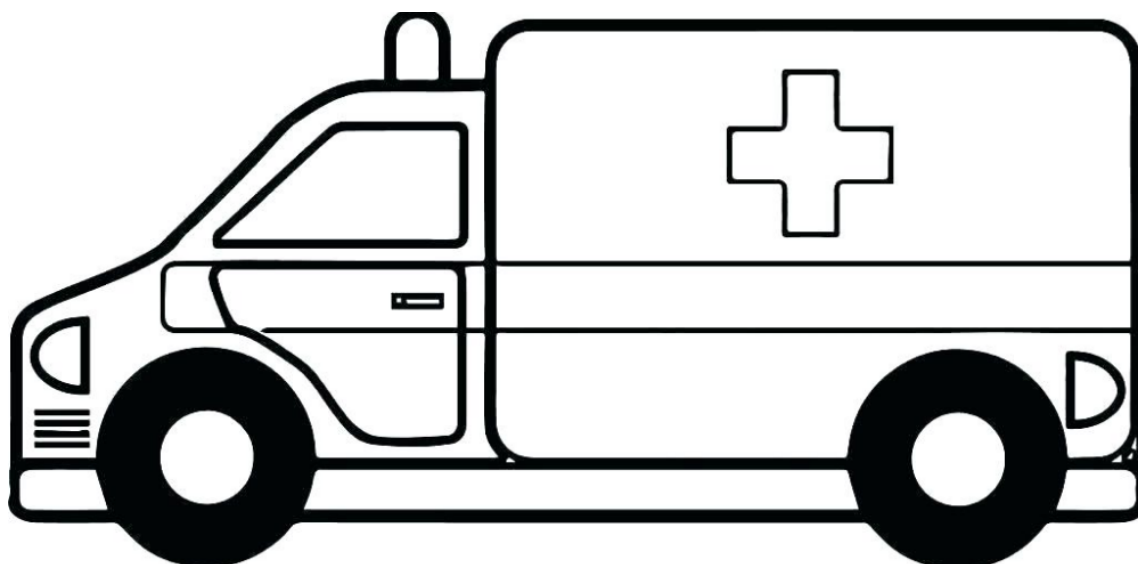
- D. If a permit has not been issued and a complaint regarding camping for more than seven (7) days is received, the number of days counted toward camping will start at day eight (8) when the complaint is received.
- E. RV's and any shelter or tent must meet the basic setbacks of the zone.
- F. If garbage or trash accumulates at the site, including in trailers or vehicles, or is left at the site, the County may revoke the camping permit and/or not issue any future camping permits until the site is cleaned up.
