



Pantry Cakes

Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 3 1/2 tsp Baking powder
- 1 tsp Salt
- 1 tbsp Cane Sugar
- 1 1/4 cup Milk
- 1 egg
- 3 tbsp butter, melted

Directions:

In a large bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Pour in milk, egg, and melted butter. Mix until smooth.

Cook over medium heat on lightly oiled griddle, pan or waffle iron. Brown on both sides.

Cheesy Cauliflower Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 medium head cauliflower, broken into florets
- 1 medium carrot, shredded
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- 2 1/2 cups water
- 1 vegetable bouillon cube
- 3 tbsp butter
- 2 1/4 tbsp rice flour
- 3/4 tsp salt
- 1/a tsp pepper
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- Optional: Hot pepper sauce, to taste.

Directions:

In a Dutch oven, combine cauliflower, carrots, celery, water and bouillon. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 12-15 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Do not drain off the liquid.

In a large saucepan, melt butter. Stir in the flour, salt and pepper until smooth. Gradually add cream. Bring to a boil over medium heat; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Reduce heat. Stir in cheese until melted, adding hot pepper sauce if desired. Stir into the cauliflower mixture until combined. Serve & enjoy

Hawaiian Chicken Sheet Pan Style

Ingredients

Sauce -

- 2 1/2 tbsp soy sauce
- 1/3 cup ketchup
- 3 tbsp pineapple juice concentrate
- 2 tbsp packed brown sugar
- 1 1/2 tbsp rice vinegar
- 2 1/2 tsp cornstarch
- 2 tsp worcestershire
- 2 tsp minced garlic
- 2 tsp peeled and minced fresh ginger
- 34 tsp freshly ground black pepper

Chicken mixture -

- $1\ V_2$ lbs boneless skinless chicken breasts, diced into 1-inch cubes
- 1 medium green bell pepper, cored and diced into 1-inch pieces
- 1 medium red bell pepper, cored and diced into
- 1-inch pieces
- 1 small red onion, chopped into chunks
- 2 cups fresh cubed pineapple
- 2 tbsp chopped cilantro

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350°

Spray a rimmed 18 by 13-inch baking sheet with non-stick cooking spray.

In a medium mixing bowl whisk together soy sauce, cornstarch, ketchup, pineapple juice concentrate, brown sugar, rice vinegar, cornstarch worcestershire, garlic, ginger, and pepper.

Place red and green bell peppers, red onion and chicken on baking sheet then pour sauce over top and toss to evenly coat.


Cook in preheated oven for 10 minutes, remove from oven and toss.

Sprinkle in pineapple. Return to oven, continue to cook until chicken is cooked through, about 7 - 10 minutes longer.

Remove from oven toss once more to coat with sauce.



The money was taken out of her account for a service she had previously cancelled. Eventually the funds were returned, but not before checks began to bounce, incurring significant overdraft charges.

This senior went from having a carefully managed budget to a disastrous amount of bank fees. Overdraft changes can result from many situations. What should you do when you're faced with overdraft charges?

Dozens of bills were passed by Oregon legislators in 2019, many of which take effect on Jan. 1, 2020. Some impact drivers, shoppers, employees and employers; others aim to protect the planet. Here's a list of some of the new laws going into effect on New Year's Day:

Accommodations for pregnancy-related conditions

House Bill 2341 expands employee protections related to pregnancy, childbirth or a related medical condition. Under the new law, employers with at least six employees must provide reasonable accommodations like longer break periods or help with manual labor.

Noncompetition agreements with employers

Under House Bill 2992, employers must provide a signed noncompete agreement to employees within 30 days after the termination of the employee's employment.

Plastic bag ban

Oregon will join California, New York and Hawaii on Jan. 1 by prohibiting retail stores and restaurants from offering single-use plastic bags. Under the Sustainable Shopping Initiative, shoppers who don't bring a reusable bag will pay a nickel fee at checkout for paper bags, reusable plastic bags and reusable fabric bags. House Bill 2509 is widely applauded as a step toward more sustainable environmental practices.

Rolling bike stop

On Jan. 1, 2020, bicyclists will be allowed to run stop signs and red lights — if the traffic will allow — without stopping. It's a version of an Idaho bill that lets bike riders treat stop signs as yields. It's still illegal to go into an intersection where motor vehicles are moving. If a biker does go into the intersection with traffic, the biker faces a fine of up to \$250.

As Bike Portland reported, the vote to pass the bill "was excruciatingly close." There were 31 ayes and 28 nays.

Oregon bottle bill changes

Oregon's existing bottle return rules are expanding to include milk and plant-based milk beverages in 4-oz containers and up. Containers that are 3 liters or less that held kombucha or hard seltzer drinks will also be redeemable. The new rules also require redemption centers to register each year with the OLCC and pay a \$3,000 fee for each center, the proceeds of which will support the program.



BACK IN THYME

EXOTIC PLANTS:

Ever wonder where some things come from? I do, and I found some very interesting things, so I am going a series of articles on these sources of our meds, some culinary items and curiosities.

AGAR:

Gelidium Cartilagineum (L.) Gaill. AGAR Family: Gelidiaceae

At first glance the comparatively plain red seaweed G. Cartilagineum does not appear to be an important plant. However, it has medicinal value, and it makes a great contribution to the bacteriological sciences.

Agar, as G. Cartilagineum is more familiarly called, is a red seaweed, a member of a large group that includes some of the worlds most beautiful seaweeds. The colors of red seaweeds, ranging from a soft rosy pink to a striking purplish red, are due to pigments that camouflage their green chlorophyll. These pigments serve to soak up light when it is scarce, and those seaweeds that inhabit deep, dark waters are more colorful then those that dwell near the light in shallow tidal areas.


Small, reddish brown and cylindrical in appearance, it reaches only about 6 inches in height, but it's diminutive size belies the toughness of its bushy stems and branches. The cells of this and other red seaweeds contain an odorless, tasteless, colorless, and transparent substance commonly called AGAR. To produce agar, the manufactures first boil the seaweed in plain water or in water which sulfuric acid has been added; then they dry and clean the gelatinous result.

One of the most interesting properties of agar is that it is indigestible by practically all bacteria. So, it is an excellent base on which to control the growth of laboratory bacterial cultures. The bacteria consume the medium in which they are grown but not the agar itself. This important fact was discovered in the 1800's by the pioneering German bacteriologist Robert Koch. Because agar is also indigestible by humans, it is a common ingredient of packaged diet foods; it fills the stomach without adding calories. In the Far East, agar has been a popular food additive for centuries. The Japanese are particularly partial to it and put it in sauces, soups, jellies and deserts. Often in the West, it is used as a gelling and stabilizing agent by meat and fish canneries and by manufacturers of baked good, dairy products and candies.

Agar's extremely useful medicinal asset is that it is hydrophobic; that is, it absorbs water. Hence, it is effective as a bulk laxative: The agar soaks up the water in the intestines and increases the bulk of waste material; the increased bulk, in turn, stimulates peristalsis (the rhythmic motions of the intestinal wall), which prompts evacuation of the wastes. Because of it water absorbent capacity, agar has also been emplayed commercially in the impression materials used by dentists and in manufacture of emulsion, lubricants, suppositories and cosmetic gels.
