



Fun Facts to Visit In Fort Rock

The exact origin of the mile-wide crater in the Fort Rock Basin of Lake County, central Oregon is a mystery. Thought to be of volcanic origin, rather than the result of an ancient meteor impact, it is some - where between 13,000 and 100,000 years old.

The ancient blast left a raised rim that reaches heights of 110-210 feet above the ground level, and an interior basin nearly 500 feet below it.

It is thought that the crater is a maar, a depression that occurs after water reacts explosively with volcanic magma, often forming crater lakes seen elsewhere, particularly in Alaska. In this case, the ancient lake bed dried up, leaving only the hole.

The area around Fort Rock Basin has a legacy of volcanic activity, leaving caches of obsidian and cinder cones along with old lava flows and caves.

The desolate landscape is so alien that astronauts were brought to the crater for training in the 1960s.

The Hole in the Ground is near another larger and more eroded maar crater known as the Big Hole.







A Sincere Thank You

This month the North Lake Health District, (NLHD), would like to honor a woman who blew into town on a whim the notorious winter of 1992, and what a fortunate breeze it was that brought Shawn Lavallee into our midst. Shawn rolled into town in '51 Studebaker bus looking for a place to settle down after traveling the states. She met a man with property for sale 11miles out of town, purchased it, and planted the roots of a life in Christmas Valley that would blossom in wide and wonderous ways.

The property was perfect! A home, outbuildings and trees; even a garden area. But the storms of that winter were severe and the property needed the work of a plumber which lead to her introduction to Steve Lavallee, who would later become her husband.

Shawn's contributions to the residents of Christmas Valley began almost immediately and she's never slowed down. In her 27 years of residency, Shawn's list of community activism and participation is impressive. During the 90's she served as the President & Vice President of Friends of the Library, served as a Booster member, was the Vice President of the Women's and Children's Resources and started a walking club. In 2004 she began volunteering at the North Lake Clinic as the "Girl Friday" one day a week performing a wide variety of duties to include blood/lab draws, scheduling and reception work. Soon her work evolved into a full-time position and she'd hoped to attend nursing school and become Pat Widenoja's assistant. Finding no openings available for classes Shawn instead opted to go to massage school; completing the one-year program from which she made the Dean's List. By 2007 Shawn was back in full swing and joined the NLHD's team of providers, running her massage business, and for a brief period, returning one day a week at the Health Clinic working much the same duties she'd previously performed.

Since her arrival, Shawn has remained an advocate for community health and wellness in mind, body and spirit. She's supported the work of other providers assisting with physical therapy, acupuncture, naturopathic medicine, teaching yoga classes, continuing with massage and is still supporting the Dolly Parton Imagination Library; a program providing monthly books, free of charge, to families of children 0-5 years of age and has graciously offered her services.

Who knows what Shawn's next community adventure will be, but it's a sure bet the community will benefit from her dedication to the health and wellbeing of locals.

On behalf of the entire community we offer our thanks and recognition for Shawn's many years supporting wellness in the community. For all the lives you've touched and those you've yet to enhance, we thank you.

GRILLED EGG

Ingredient:

Raw egg in the shell, as many as you would like to enjoy.

Directions:

Place the raw egg in its shell on the grate over a gentle fire or medium-low heat. Grill, turning with tongs, until the egg is cooked through, 3 to 4 minutes per side. *Find more recipes like this one on barbecuebible.com

Baked Beans, Boston Style

Ingredient List:

- 2 cups Dry Navy beans
- 1/2 cup salt pork, chopped
- 1/2 Tbsp sea salt
- 1 heaping Tbsp molasses
- 1 1/2 Tbsp maple syrup
- 1/4 tsp ground mustard
- 1/2 cup boiling water plus enough to cover the beans, about 2 cups.

Directions:

The night before you plan to cook your beans, take the two cups of beans and put them in a saucepan or pot - remove any broken or shriveled ones. Pour enough water into the pan to cover the beans and let them sit overnight.

In the morning, strain the beans and discard the water. Give the beans a quick rinse in a strainer, then put them back in the saucepan with fresh water. Let the beans simmer in the water for about 40 minutes. Then strain the beans again and put them in a pot you plan to bake them in. Put the pork, salt, molasses, syrup, and mustard in with the beans and mix them all together. Pour 1/2 cup of boiling water over the beans and then add enough cool water to make sure the beans are covered - about 2 more cups. Then cover the pot and put it in the oven to bake. Bake at 325° for the first 2 hours then lower the over temperature to 280° for 3+ hours. *Check the beans every once in a while to make sure they do not dry out, add a bit more water if necessary. Take the cover off the pot for the last hour of cooking.

Corn Muffins

Ingredient List:

- 1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
- 3 Tbsp sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 cup yellow or white corn meal
- 1 egg, well beaten
- 3/3 cup buttermilk
- 1/4 cup vegetable shortening, melted and cooled

Directions:

Sift flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt into a large bowel; stir in corn meal. Mix eggs, buttermilk, and shortening in a 1 cup measure, add all at once to the flour mixture. Stir lightly with a fork until the liquid is absorbed. The batter will be lumpy. Spoon into greased medium sized muffin tin - filling ¾ full.

Bake at 400° for 20 minutes or until golden brown. Serve Hot.




