What Time Is My Appointment?

Your North Lake Health District (NLHD) is proud of the stability and variety of services that is offered to our community through La Pine Community Health Center (LCHC). Christmas Valley locals have the opportunity to enjoy many of the "big city" services delivered in a "down home" way.

LCHC's Christmas Valley site is located in the North Lake Health District Medical Center. Denise Griffiths, FNP offers primary medical care Monday through Thursday and Megan Lewis, FNP is available each Friday. Michael Allen, DO, LCHC's Chief Medical Officer, comes to the Christmas Valley site on the second and fourth Thursday's of each month to treat newborns, prenatal patients and patient with multiple conditions at the request of their primary care provider. X-rays are now available on Tuesdays and Thursdays and Behavioral Health services are available on Tuesdays. The Outreach and Health Education teams host many periodic programs such as free smoking cessation courses, dental screenings and incentives for well child checks and colon screenings. There is also year-round support to residents with Oregon Health Plan (OHP) enrollment assistance, a discounted fee program, transportation assistance, emergency resources for personal hygiene supplies and many other resources.

The staff at LCHC in Christmas Valley are continually working to build relationships and increase awareness of the services offered in our community, but are still faced with some challenges. In rural communities such as ours it's a balancing act to operate in a way that will support the financial stability of the center while also meeting the needs of the public. To meet that balance, the appointment schedule currently only requires one primary care provider to be on duty each day which on occasion can make it difficult to respond to all "walk-in" patients. Here are some tips to follow so that you can receive the best care:

Not an Urgent Care Facility - LCHC operates as a primary care facility and is not staffed to provide immediate response as an urgent care facility.

<u>Scheduled Appointments Take Priority</u> - It is not appropriate for the primary care provider to shorten their time with one patient to accommodate a "walk-in" unless an actual emergency is at hand.

<u>Make Your Appointment in Advance</u> - Making your appointment in advance, even same day, helps them to serve you best and allows you the choice of waiting to be seen in the comfort of your own home.

<u>Arrive On Time</u> - Being on time for your appointment helps ensure your provider has time to be attentive to your needs, as well as the needs of every patient that follows you throughout the rest of the day.

<u>Call Ahead</u> - If you're able, call before coming in as a "walk-in". If your need is indeed urgent a brief conversation can serve you well whether accommodations are made to work you in to the schedule or you are advised to seek care at an urgent care facility or by calling 9-1-1.

The providers at your La Pine Community Health Center are dedicated to your health and work hard to support your well-being. Let's work with them to support their efforts in creating a healthier community.

Vocational Career Center Coming to North Lake School

North Lake's Agriculture and Technology program will be seeing some big changes next fall when students report to school, thanks to Measure 98 funds which were approved by the Oregon voters in 2016 and set aside for Career Technical Education and High School Dropout Prevention. A collaborative team including Chad Waldron, the current Agriculture Teacher and FFA Advisor, School Administration, high school staff and the Agriculture Advisory Committee developed a four phase plan.

The first part of the plan was to establish a much needed Alternative Education program in the old annex building. Brad Chastain was hired to head up the program. The program has been very successful. Mr. Chastain sees up to 17 students every day in an effort to help students stay on track, or get back on track to graduate. This year the alt ed program helped students earn 75 high school credits.

North Lake is now in phase two of the plan, which includes vocational education opportunities for students. The Vocational Career Center, a 1,800 square foot pole barn frame was constructed this spring north of the existing shop. Chastain will be teaching two vocational classes in the afternoon and will use the opportunity to finish the building.

Waldron will continue to teach the traditional agriculture classes including Jr. High Shop, Natural Resources, Animal Science, Plant Science, AutoCAD and Metal and Wood shop, as well as be responsible for the lion share of the FFA duties. Chastain will be responsible for the FFA Ag. Sales and Marketing teams, and will teach two class periods of Agricultural Business and Vocational Careers, focusing on job skills and construction trades. Eventually the building will reach phase three of the plan and will consist of six separate modules where students learn and practice career technical skills: Electrical, Framing, Roofing, Plumbing, Drywall/Paint and HVAC.

By 2021, Chastain and Waldron envision the program to evolve into a fullon, self-sustaining entrepreneur business model where students design, plan, build and market small homes to address poverty and homelessness in the North Lake community.


