



Trail Camps are Cleared

Antler Horse Camp to Silver Creek to Farm Well Horse Camp have been cleared. Camp Ground is in great shape thanks to the help of the Bicyclist.

Here's a few places to ride:

Fremont National Recreation Trail 160, This trail starts at the top of Yamsay Mountain and ends at the Government Harvey Pass. Views are breath taking so take time to enjoy the view.

Antler Horse Camp out of Silver Lake you can head west to Yamsay or go East to the Silver Creek Marsh. Antler is a bit rocky, there is water for the horse's but you will need to bring water for yourself to drink.

Silver Creek March is in a forest setting with 17 tent and trailer sites, picnic tables and fire grates.

Farm Well Horse Camp has campsites and suitable for trucks with trailers and RV's.

Things to do with the Kids

Crack In The Ground is a fissure that formed between cooling lava flows about 1100 years ago. The fissure is about 2 miles long and 70 feet deep. The length of the fissure can be hiked, as there is an established trail along the fissure's bottom. Normally, fissures like this one are filled in with soil and rock by the processes of erosion and sedimentation, but because Crack in the Ground is located in such an arid region, barely any filling has occurred. As a result, Crack in the Ground exists today nearly as it did shortly after its formation. When you get there it is easy to cool off, as the bottom of the crack can be as much as twenty degrees below the surface temperature.

Fruit Stuffed Wild Goose

Sprinkle Goose inside and out with lemon juice, salt & pepper.

Melt 1/4 cup butter in large skillet, add 1/4 cup chopped onion and cook till tender. Stir in 1 cup tart apple chopped, 1 cup dried apricots, 3 cups soft bread crumbs (use day old bread), salt and pepper.

Spoon stuffing into cavity, sew shut. Cover breast with bacon slices and cheesecloth soaked in melted bacon fat. Place goose breast up in roasting pan.

Roast @ 325 degrees for 25 minutes per pound or till tender. Baste often with bacon fat and pan drippings. If gooses age is uncertain pour 1 cup water in the pan and cover the last hour of cooking.

Remembering Our Elders Part 6

Aging Eyes Deteriorating Eyesight

Almost everyone over 45 notices a change in eyesight. We laugh at ourselves as well as get frustrated when we go or to dinner and the menus arrive. We hold the menus back and forth, trying to find the best range of vision as we think "when did they start making the type so small?" When the near vision begins to fade, it is time to take action. A few faithful herbs and persistence will make a general improvement in eyesight!

Compared to other organs, our eyes are relatively small and very complex. Eyes are the windows to the soul as well as the outer world and fill our life with vibrant colors and visual stimuli. They can become over used and worn. They need to rest, to exercise, and properly nourished in order to function well. As dependent as we are on our vision, we tend to neglect the health of our eyes unless they are functioning poorly. Routine eye care should be routine like tooth brushing and flossing as they respond quickly to a bit of simple care.


Rest Your Eyes

Eyestrain is a common cause of deteriorating eyesight. Without rest, they become tired and do not function at optimal levels. Working on computers, watching Television, reading in poor light, and stress can cause eyestrain. Soft warm light is best! If your eyes need a break during the day, Try eyecupping. A fun to do, marvelous technique. Simply rub your palms together vigorously, then place them against your eyes, pressing firmly and count to 50, enjoying the light show all the while.

In the evening, refresh your eyes with a warm chamomile poultice. Use 2 tea bags or 2 TBSp. loose chamomile in 1/2 cup hot water. Soak cotton balls or cotton squares in the tea. Cool to acceptable temp., wring gently so there is no drip, place over eyes, turn lights on low, turn on relaxing music, lie back and enjoy for 20 to 30 minutes.

Proper exercise of eyes improves circulation and muscle coordination. Eye exercises take only a few minutes of daily practice and make your eyes feel and see significantly better. Start by turning your eyes as far to the right as you can, stretching the muscles, pause, roll eyes slowly up to the center top, rolling them as far back as you can, as if you were trying to see into the top of your head, pause, continue rolling slowly to the left as far as you can, pause then move eyes together, toward tip of nose. Repeat all 4 times, then reverse directions. When you are done, eyes will feel rejuvenated, and muscles will feel relaxed.




