Meaning of Thanksgiving

Meaning of Thanksgiving - The Real Celebration

For many of us, the meaning of Thanksgiving usually includes feasting, four-day weekends, football games, floats, family reunions, or a forerunner to Christmas festivities. The "first Thanksgiving," however, was neither a feast nor a holiday, but a simple gathering. Following the Mayflower's arrival at Plymouth Rock on December 11, 1620, the Pilgrims suffered the loss of 46 of their original 102 colonists. With the help of 91 Indians, the remaining Pilgrims survived the bitter winter and yielded a bountiful harvest in 1621. In celebration, a traditional English harvest festival, lasting three days brought the Pilgrims and natives to unite in a "thanksgiving" observance.

This "thanksgiving" meal would not be celebrated again until June of 1676. On June 29 the community of Charlestown, Massachusetts proclaimed a day of thanksgiving for their good fortune. Ironically, this celebration excluded the Indians, as the colonists' recognized their recent victory over the "heathen natives." One hundred years later, in October of 1777, all 13 colonies participated in a one-time "thanksgiving" celebration which commemorated the patriotic victory over the British at Saratoga. It would take a span of over 150 more years to establish Thanksgiving as we celebrate it --

George Washington proclaimed it a National holiday in 1789, Lincoln proclaimed the last Thursday in November in 1863, and Congress sanctioned it as a legal holiday in 1941

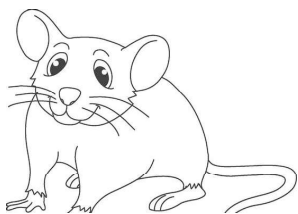
PUBLIC NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY given that the Lake County Board of Commissioners is seeking three (3) volunteers to serve on the Planning Commission: Position 3 (South Lake), Position 4 (Central Lake) and Position 5 (North Lake). Volunteers participate in public hearings regarding land-use proposals on private property, located outside the town/city limits of Lakeview and Paisley which are required to be reviewed for compliance with Local and State law, and compatibility with adjacent property land-uses, and suitability given the properties size, location, physical constraints, etc. Ideally, members are appointed by the Board of County Commissioners for a four-year term.

Regular meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month at 6:00pm in the Lake County Courthouse located at 513 Center St in Lakeview, and occasionally at other meeting places in the various rural communities within the county. Meetings typically last from one to three hours. The positions are unpaid; however, reimbursement will be paid for mileage costs relating to meeting attendance.

If you are interested in becoming a member of the Planning Commission, please stop by the Planning Department or Board of County Commissioners Assistant's Office to pick up an application, or call 541-947-6036 to get one mailed/emailed to you. The application is also available at www.lakecountyor.org. Please respond as soon as possible, preferably before December 3, 2019 at close of business so the Planning Commission can review the applicants before making a recommendation to the Board of Commissioners.

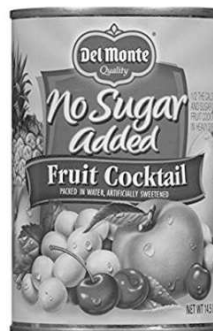

Mississippi Pot Roast

Ingredients:

1 4lb chuck roast
1 stick unsalted butter
1 packet Hidden Valley Ranch dressing mix

Ingredients:

2 Tbsp. butter
1 small onion, chopped
1 cloves garlic, minced
20 oz Tonnino Tuna Fillets in Spring Water, drained, flaked
1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
1 cup broccoli, minced and lightly steamed
½ cup whole milk
½ tsp. dried oregano leaves
¼ tsp. ground black pepper
9 lasagna noodles, cooked
15 oz. Ricotta Cheese
1 pkg. Slim Cut Mozzarella Cheese Slices
KRAFT Grated Parmesan Cheese
10 Original style Pringles, crushed

Directions:

Heat oven to 350°F.
Melt butter in a medium skillet on medium heat. Add onions and garlic; cook and stir about 5 minutes or until onions are crisp but tender. Remove from heat. Stir in flaked tuna, soup, broccoli, milk, oregano and pepper. Grease 13x9-inch baking and spread ¾ cup of the tuna mixture onto the bottom. Top with layers of 3 noodles, ¾ cup of tuna mixture, half the ricotta cheese and 6 mozzarella slices. Repeat layers of noodles, tuna mixture, ricotta and mozzarella. Cover with remaining noodles, tuna mixture and mozzarella. Sprinkle with Parmesan
Bake 25 to 30 min. or until heated through. Remove from oven and top chips. Let stand 10 min. before cutting to serve.

Seared Sausage with Cabbage and Apples

Ingredients:

1 Tbsp. olive oil
6 Sweet Italian sausage links (about 1 ½ pounds total)
2 Honey Crisp apples, halved
½ red onion, sliced
½ head red cabbage, cut into ½" thick slices
Kosher salt
freshly ground black pepper
1 c. fresh apple cider
2 tbsp. fresh cider vinegar

Directions:

Heat the oil in a large cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat. Add sausage and cook, turning occasionally, until golden brown, transfer to a plate. Reduce heat to medium and add apples, cut-sides down. Scatter onion and cabbage around apples. Season with salt and pepper. Cook until apples are golden brown, stirring onion occasionally. Flip apples. Return sausage to skillet, nestling among vegetables. Add cider and vinegar. Simmer, rotating and turning sausages occasionally, until sausages are cooked through and apples are tender. 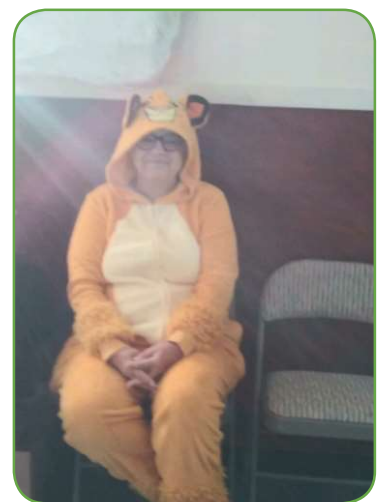
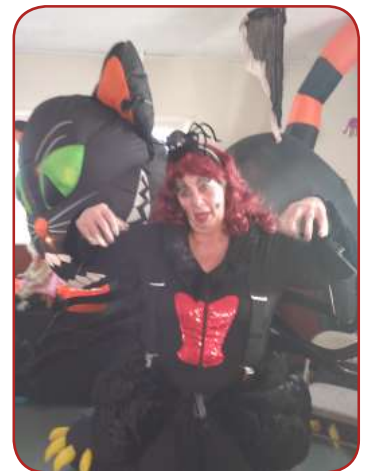

MIRACULOUS MAGNESIUM

Mix more magnesium into your diet, and you may be surprised how much your body will thank you. Magnesium is necessary for more than 300 exosomatic reactions in the body, it plays a chief role in regulating blood glucose levels and blood pressure, and ensures the conductivity of electrical impulses for a regular heart beat.
