## BACK IN THYME

### CBD:Plant Medicine Part 4

#### CANNABIS- DERIVED CBD

If you live in a State that has recreational and medical use legal, you can get CBD products from a licensed dispensary. You can also get better quality products if you have a medical card. CBD derived from cannabis has various amounts of THC depending on you preference. Some people prefer cannabis - derived CBD as CBD and THC work very well together creating what's known as the "entourage effect, where each enhances the therapeutic benefits of the other.

There are strains of cannabis bed specifically to be high in CBD and low in THC, including "ACDC" "Cannatonic", "Charlotte's Web", "Ringo's Guift" "Sour Tsunami", "Harlequin", and "Hawaiian Dream".

With extracts like CBD oils and tinctures, you can find different ratios. A ratio (15:1) (10:1) or (7:1). For some having just a little THC enhances the overall benefits of CBD without negative side effects. Scientific research is on going for the anecdotal, evidence of its therapeutic profile and medicinal benefits.

#### ISOLATE, FULL SPECTRUM AND BRAD SPECTRUM CBD:

There are three choices that to the extraction process.


- CBD isolate is more than 99 percent pure CBD, also called " whole plant formula", extracts CBD along with other beneficial phytocannabinoids. Including trace amounts of THC as well as terpenes and flavonoids.
- Full spectrum CBD, also called " whole plant formula", extracts CBD along with other beneficial phytocannabinolds including trace amounts of THC as well as terpenes and flavonoids.
- Broad spectrum CBD isolate is pure CBD is like full spectrum but contains zero THC. While CBD isolate is pre CBD, researchers believe that full and broad spectrum extracts offer more therapeutic value, as they're more bioavailable and activate more benefits.

#### DELIVERY AND DOSAGE:

How you choose to consume CBD depends on what you wish to treat, the effect you hope to achieve, how long you want it to last, and what feels the most comfortable and convenient for you. No "dosing protocol" or medical predictability exists, which makes dosing a bit tricky , so you will have to experiment, "low and Slow" is key: Start with a low dosage and take it slow. There's not a single documented case in the world of anyone dying from cannabis overdose. But you can overdose yourself resulting in symptoms like high anxiety and paranoia from intense psychoactive effects. Don't rush the process; start with 5-10mg and go from there. Some people react slower then others so go slow and see how you feel.
