# BACK IN THYME

# THE HEART

Adequate magnesium intake yields incredible results for cardiovascular health, producing a 58 percent lower chance of calcium deposits on arterial walls. As a crucial electrolyte, adequate intake reduces the risk of hypertension and regulates a normal heart rhythm.

### **NEUROLOGICALLY**

Magnesium protects the brain which makes it crucial for brain health. A strong, intact blood, brain barrier comes from adequate magnesium levels. Brain functions related to this mineral include the regulation of amyloid plaque, which protect the body from Alzheimer's disease. Studies show people with dementia and Alzheimer's have low blood levels of magnesium and are more prone to Parkinson's disease. Magnesium supplements can improve cognition and slow the progress of Alzheimer's. Magnesium has been shown to protect against brain swelling and lower instances of death after a stroke, as well as it facilitates spatial memory retention. The brain requites consistent magnesium levels for neurotransmitters to work effectively in the body. Neurotransmitter GABA requires magnesium in order to produce its calming effects. GABA can dominate the neurologic and keep the fear and anxiety neurotransmitter glutamate in check and help synthesize the neurotransmitter dopamine., which stimulates motivation and feeling of reward without high enough levels of dopamine, symptoms of apathy, agitation and depression ten to dominate ones mood. Magnesium aids in maintaining a positive mood by transforming the amino acid tryptophan in the mood - elevating neurotransmitter serotonin. Elders suffering from depression and type 2 diabetes were given magnesium glycinate with meals and at bed time showed mood improvement after 12 weeks.




