Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Memorial Day 2020 occurs on Monday, May 25.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season.

Early Observances of Memorial Day

The Civil War, which ended in the spring of 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries.

By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers.

Did you know? Each year on Memorial Day a national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m. local time.

It is unclear where exactly this tradition originated; numerous different communities may have independently initiated the memorial gatherings. And some records show that one of the earliest Memorial Day commemoration was organized by a group of freed slaves in Charleston, South Carolina less than a month after the Confederacy surrendered in 1865. Nevertheless, in 1966 the federal government declared Waterloo, New York, the official birthplace of Memorial Day.



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

Monday May 11, the Lake County Fair Board held an 'Emergency/Special' meeting, along with representatives from the Round-Up Association; Market Sale Committee: 4-H and FFA to discuss 'where do we go from here with regards to the Covid-19 and the Governor's re-opening plan?' It was unanimously agreed by all parties, that we are moving forward with plans for the 2020 Fair & Round-Up. Zucchini Pie

Ingredients

1/2 cup canola oil

4 eggs

1 cup Bisquick

1/2 cup Parmesan cheese

1/2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

1 small sweet onion, diced

3 cups zucchini, sliced very thin

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Spray a 9-inch pie plate with cooking spray and set aside.

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Pour into the prepared dish.

Bake for 40-45 minutes, or until cooked through and golden brown.

Baked Custard

Ingredients

4 large eggs

1/2 cup Monk Fruit Sweetener

1/2 tsp salt

1 tsp vanilla extract

4 cups 2% milk

1/2 tsp ground nut meg

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. In a medium-size bowl, beat the eggs on medium-low speed for 30 seconds. Add the sugar, salt and vanilla. Whisk gently until mixed. Pour the milk into a microwave-safe bowl and heat in 1 minute increments until the temperature of the milk reaches 180 degrees. Stir between each time interval to distribute the heat. Depending on the bowl and microwave you use, this will take about 5 minutes. Be sure not to let the milk boil. Remove 1 cup of the heated milk and slowly drizzle it into the egg mixture,

whisking the eggs quickly the entire time. Slowly pour the remainder of the milk over the egg mixture, whisking constantly. Beat with a hand mixer for 20-30 seconds. Pour the custard into 10 6-ounce ramekins, dividing equally between the cups (no need to grease the ramekins). Place the ramekins in a 10x15" baking pan with sides about as tall as the ramekins. Sprinkle nutmeg over top the custard. Heat about 10 cups of water, not quite to a boiling but very hot, on the stovetop or in the microwave. Pour the hot water into the pan around the ramekins, being careful not to get any of the water into the custard itself. Carefully place the pan into the preheated oven and bake for 35-40 minutes. The exact time may depend on the size and shape of the ramekins you use. The custard is done when you insert a knife into the center of a cup and it comes out clean. Serve warm or cold. Refrigerate any leftovers

Blackberry Jam Cake

Cake Ingredients

1 box white cake mix (16.25 ounces) 1 package blackberry Fusion Jell-o

(3 ounces) ½ cup milk 2%

1/2 cup milk 2%

3/4 cup avocado oil

4 large eggs

1 cup fresh blackberry puree

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine the cake mix, gelatin, milk, oil, eggs and fresh puree. Beat on low speed until mixed, then beat on medium speed for 2 min. Grease and flour a 13" x 9" pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 35 minutes, or until the

Strawberry Frosting Ingredients

1 cups butter softened

4 cups powdered sugar

1 teaspoons vanilla extract

1/4 cup heavy cream (plus more if

1/3 cup seedless blackberry jam

the Frosting

In the bowl of a stand mixer, cream the softened butter for 1-2 minutes until nearly white in appearance. Add 1½ cups of powdered sugar and the vanilla extract. Beat on low for 1 minute. Scrape down the sides of the bowl. Mix in the heavy cream and another 1½ cups of powdered

Add in 1 additional cup of powdered sugar and the jam. Beat on low speed until mixed, then beat on medium speed for 1-2 minutes, until the frosting is creamy and smooth, scraping down the sides as needed.

To Frost the Cake

Spread frosting on top and sides, if desired. Store at room temperature until serving, then store leftovers in the refrigerator.

Optional: Decorate top with fresh blackberries.



CHAT: Catha edulin (Uohl) Forsk. ExEnd L

Staff- Tree Gamily - Celastraceae

From the air, the upland hill of Ethiopia's Harar Province look like an immense, carpeted staircase to the sky. Closer in spection reveals the textured carpet that cover the vast steps to be made up of undulation rows of small, leafy trees. In bloom, the trees little white flower seem to dust the landscape like a light snowfall. But this is not the reason that the African evergreen has sometimes been called the flower of paradise. It has earned the idyllic name by virtue of the effect its leaves have on people.

The trees are generally called chat (also spelled khat, Kat or Qat), although they may grow 20 to 50 feet high in the wild they are kept in a shrub like state, no higher than 10 feet in cultivation so that the upper leaves can be easily reached and harvested.

For hundreds of years, perhaps much longer, the farmers of the region have taken bunches of the leaves to chew as they worked. They would chew these quids for about 10 minutes, swallowing the juice, the juice as it accumulated and finally swallowing the leaves themselves. The effect are much the same as those of the coca leaves chewed by South American Indians: increased alertness, relief from hunger and fatigue, mild euphoria.

(chat) The substance that has this effect a boon to farmers who must labor under difficult conditions from dawn till dark is a stimulant to the central nervous system known by the jaw breaking name D-Norpseudoephedrine.

Although Western scientists warn that insufficient research has been preformed to determine the substance's medicinal value, if any, its use is on the increase in Africa.

In Ethiopia, the major exporter of chat, the upper branches of the tree are harvested and wrapped in protective banana leaves, then shipped by air to nearby countries. Time is of the essence; the active ingredient loses much of its potency with in three days. While some of the leaves are chewed, most are brewed with water and honey to make Arabian tea, an important beverage among Arab peoples.


Sheriff's Report
