Bond Update:

We have been months in the planning, but we have finally broken ground!

Since the bond passed in May, 2019 we have been busy behind the scenes. We worked for several months with bond attorneys and financial advisors to prepare for the sale of the bonds. That sale took place in August. We have since hired a Project Construction Manager (Mike Tiller from Bend), an architect (Scott Steele Architects from Bend) and a contractor (Griffin Construction from Prineville) through a comprehensive bidding and interview process.

The last six months have included in depth evaluation of the design, engineering, systems analysis and the tying in of a new addition to the existing building. We went through a sub-contractors bidding process and an in depth permitting process with Lake County. Various code changes over the years required additional analysis of how to use existing systems with new construction.

On April 13th Griffin Construction began moving equipment in and fencing off the construction work area. On Monday, April 20, we broke ground. Our first step is removing the playground asphalt and cutting into the hill side. Excavation will take some time before footing and foundation work begins. We had intended to remove and replace the old annex building. However, the cost of new modular buildings has exploded and is now cost prohibitive. We will tear that building down to the studs and rebuild from the foundation up! That building should be ready to occupy when students return in September!

The bus maintenance facility will begin possibly in the fall. The entire project (including the new

classrooms and gym) should be completed prior to March, 2021. We still believe that this addition will meet the needs of our students and community for the next 20 years.



LAKEVIEW, Ore.—April 29, 2020—The Lake County Library District is working on a phased reopening plan for the libraries to tie in with the county and state-wide plans. The draft plan proposes five different library service levels in response to different internal and external criteria, such as whether there is COVID-19 spreading in the area and whether the library has the needed cleaning supplies and equipment. The library plans to use the Lake County and State reopening plans to further inform the library plan when those documents are finalized.

Currently, the biggest barrier to reopening that the library is facing is purchasing disinfecting products and gloves for cleaning frequently touched surfaces. "We were very lucky to have supplies on hand that have allowed us to continue offering Library Take Out service," said Library Director Amy Hutchinson. "But those supplies would quickly be exhausted if we invited the public into our buildings again and needed to regularly disinfect public computers, tables, and chairs," said Hutchinson. Library staff will continue working to secure the needed supplies, but disinfecting supply shortages are widespread.

Hutchinson plans to present the draft plan to the library board at the May meeting, which will be scheduled in conjunction with the Budget Committee meeting. For updated information, visit the Lake County Library District website at www.lakecountylibrary.org.





EXOTIC PLANTS

CASTOR OIL PLANT: RICINUS COMMUROIS L. SPURGE FAMILY: Euphorbiaceae

An African tree that grows in warm areas throughout the world and is now cultivated by American and European gardener as a foliage plant. In this native habitat, the castor oil plant is a tree 30 to 40 feet high, bearing broad, deeply lobed leaves on long stalks. The leaves are purple bronze when young, gray green or dark maroon when mature. The petalless female flowers, grow in clusters above the male flowers, develop into bur like capsules containing three seeds each. When the capsules mature and dry out, they explode, scattering their beans. Shrubby dwarf strains no more than 5 feet high have been developed in cultivation, bearing non explosive capsules.

The Egyptians used castor oil and as an unguent; they also purged their systems three times a month by drinking the oil mixed with beer. The Greeks and Romans taking note, no doubt, that the beans are poisonous used the oil only externally. In the late 18th century, the foul tasting substance regained its ancient role as a laxative.

The beans poisonous substance, ricin, is one of the deadliest toxins known; eating a single castor bean can kill a child. Fortunately extracting the oil without the ricin is fairly simple process. The key is temperature. Heat is used to extract oil from most seeds, but when castor beans are heated, the ricin from the bean is distributed throughout the oil. When the beans are hulled and crushed at temps below 100F, however, they yield a clear or yellowish poison free oil rich in another substance, ricinolein, which irritates the intestines, causing them to expel their contents.


Castor oil has several commercial applications as well. Because it is insoluble in benzine and has a very low freezing point, it is well suited for the lubrication of airplane engines. It is also used in hydraulic brake fluids and in biodegradable laundry detergents, paints and varnishes. Oil meant for these purposes is extracted by heat and is poisonous.
