



'Outraged' Oregon residents petition to join Idaho By Marina Pitofsky - 02/18/20

A group of Oregon residents is petitioning to have two counties in their state join Idaho, citing Oregon's Democratic leadership.

Move Oregon's Border for a Greater Idaho said Josephine and Douglas counties have accepted ballot initiatives supporting a goal of joining Idaho, the organization said in a press release earlier this month.

The Josephine County ballot initiative specifically "makes it county policy to cooperate with any state effort to move the Oregon/Idaho border, if any such effort develops," the group said.

The Douglas County Initiative amends a current ordinance to "add Idaho officials to the list of officials who may be lobbied by Douglas County commissioners. The suggested ballot question is 'Shall the County Board be authorized to advocate for Idaho legislation, such as making this county a county of Idaho?" the group noted.

The group must gather 2,429 signatures in Josephine County by Aug. 5 and 2,955 signatures from Douglas County residents to appear on the ballot in the general election in November. Mike McCarter of La Pine, Ore., and Valerie Gottschalk of Selma, Ore., are the "chief petitioners" and leaders of the "movement," the group said.

"Rural counties have become increasingly outraged by laws coming out of the Oregon Legislature that threaten our livelihoods, our industries, our wallet, our gun rights, and our values. We tried voting those legislators out but rural Oregon is outnumbered and our voices are now ignored. This is our last resort," McCarter said in a statement.

Last year, there were two failed efforts to recall Democratic Oregon Gov. Kate Brown, Oregon Public Broadcasting reported. Gottschalk said the "response" to a "Recall Kate" petition made her "expect this movement to grow rapidly."

"People here would prefer Idaho's conservative governance to the progressive/liberal current Oregon governance. Every time I look at the Facebook group Greater Idaho, the group has gotten bigger," she said.

The group is also aiming to add rural California counties to the expanded Idaho border. Idaho would gain coastline in Oregon's Douglas County, Coos County, Curry County and California's Del Norte County under the plan.

WHAT'S IN THE WORKS WITH BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

Many of you may be have read recent articles in the Lakeview Examiner regarding the North Lake Health District's (NLHD) efforts to secure expanded behavioral health services in the north end of the county. The discussion and supporting actions to expand services have been underway since the summer of 2018. Your NLHD has continued in its efforts to secure services through the Lake District Hospital's Wellness Center.

Locally, the NLHD renovated the old physical therapy room in the clinic to provide office space for private behavioral health counseling and have made the conference room available for group educational activities provided by The Wellness Center. We continue to work with the Lake District Hospital to secure services. Our board president accompanied by a representative of the La Pine Community Health Center recently attended a Lake County commissioner's meeting to address needs and concerns about moving forward.

These services are vital to the entire community, not just those individuals seeking counseling, and the need to expand services are critical to the health and welfare of the communities on the north end of the county. Your NLHD has, and will continue to be, involved in the pursuit of expanded services. As always, we welcome community participation and would, particularly in this endeavor, appreciate community involvement. We encourage you to attend our board meetings to enable you to understand the information you may have read in the Lakeview Examiner and also to ensure you are fully informed of who's involved in the process, the concerns being raised, community needs and steps that are being taken to secure expanded services.

This graceful palm can get as tall as 100 feet, but usually averages 30 to 50 feet, has a narrow trunk never wider then 6 inches in diameter with a relatively small crown. Its frond are erect and feathery divided leaves, 3 - 6 feet long and sometimes variegated in color. The fragrant whitish male flowers are on the upper part of the flowering branches with the large female ones at the base. The egg shaped, orange red fruits contain small seeds, about 2 inches long, commonly called betel nuts.

This nut was made famous in James Michener's Tales of the South Pacific. If you have read this book, or seen the stage or movie musicals that were based on it, you may remember the Native woman Bloody Mary. Michener's depiction of her was: "She had few teeth... and had thin ravines running out from the corners of her mouth... usually filled with betel juice which made her look as if her mouth had been gashed by a razor." This description shows the author knew something about the centuries - old Southeast Asian habit of chewing betel nuts. (The Chinese discovered the practice when they conquered the Malay Archipelago in 150 B.C.)

The Asians wrap a leaf of the local spicy betel pepper vine (Piper Betle) around a small piece of freshly roasted betel nut, add a pinch of powered lime, and chew the mixture as a stimulant that gives a feeling of general well - being, aids digestion, sweetens breath, and strengthens the gums.


The betel nut contains tannins that give it an astringent effect, and several powerful alkaloids especially one called arecoline that promotes the secretion of saliva and intestinal juices. The nut also turns saliva red, ergo Bloody Mary's appearance and name.

In 1863 betel nut's active alkaloids were identified by Western scientists. Arecoline is an effective taeniacide, agent that destrous tapeworms. It also treats urinary tract problems. Large does have been found to have severe toxic side effects in humans, but it is still used in veterinary medicine.

Betel palm is widely cultivated in India and Jri Lanka, and betel chewing is still widely used throughtout most of Southeast Asia.

LAKE COUNTY SHERIFF REPORT

February 10th, Deputies responded to the Chevron Station regarding several suspects passing forged twenty dollar bills. One suspect presented a forged twenty dollar bill and asked for two ten dollar bills in exchange. The teller gave change prior to noticing that the twenty was a fake bill. The suspect had left the Chevron but was located a short time later in front of the Coyote Quick Stop sitting in the driver's seat of a vehicle. When questioned about the fake bill the suspect stated she did not know the bill was fake. Deputies were informed by another Deputy that the suspect recently attempted to pass a fake twenty at the CFN Station. Upon searching the suspect more fake bills were located to include a fake 100 dollar bill, a fake 20 dollar bill and a fake 5 dollar bill. The suspect was subsequently arrested for Forgery I, PCS-meth and PCS schedule II. The investigation has been forwarded to the DA's Office for charging.

February 10th, Deputies, probation and parole and OSP responded to the 1100 block of South E Street attempting to make contact with a female who had multiple felony warrants for her arrest. Upon entering the residence the female suspect and a male suspect who is currently on probation were found in the house. The female was arrested for the warrants and possession of methamphetamine. The male was arrested for violating his probation. Both suspects were transported to the Lake County Correction's Facility and booked. The investigation has been forwarded to the DA's Office for charging.

The principal was notified and contacted law enforcement. The parents of all involved have been contacted and informed of the incident.
